Internal audit is the periodic independent review of a council's internal controls resulting in an assurance report designed to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the activities and operating procedures under the council's control. Managing the council's internal controls should be a day-to-day function of the council through its staff and management and not left for internal audit. It would be incorrect to view internal audit as the detailed inspection of all records and transactions of a council in order to detect error or fraud. This report is based on the evidence made available to me and consequently the report is limited to those matters set out below.

The council is required to take appropriate action on all matters raised in reports from internal and external audit and to respond to matters brought to its attention by internal and external audit. Failure to take appropriate action may lead to a qualified audit opinion.

To the Chairman of the Council:

I carried out the audit remotely, followed by an online meeting with the Clerk Sue Porter. I would like to thank Sue for her co-operation and assistance during the meeting and for forwarding the year-end data in good time which has been very helpful to me in delivering the audit.

I firstly examined the publicly available information displayed on the council's website including the council's policies, procedures, agendas, minutes, financial and other records.

I examined the council's arrangements for the management and control of its business in the areas of bookkeeping, due process (ie compliance with the 'proper practices' as set out in the Practitioners' Guide), risk management, budget setting and monitoring, payroll, asset register, bank reconciliations, internal control and year-end procedures including the display of information including the exercise of public rights. At our meeting, the Clerk, Chair to the Council and myself discussed a few areas that of good practice.

The Council, together with and supported by its diligent and competent Clerk, has continued to demonstrate and deliver consistently good standards of governance and management throughout the year in all matters. I am, therefore, pleased to be able to report that having tested all the aspects of the council's internal controls that I am required to consider, & based on the information made available to me, I am satisfied that in all respects the internal control objectives were achieved throughout the financial year to a standard adequate to meet the Council's needs. Accordingly, I have completed and signed off the Annual Internal Audit Report as required.
