Anthony writes...

When did you start collecting stamps?

I started collecting when I was about 8, encouraged by my grandparents. I accumulated for a couple of years before losing interest. Six years ago, I bought a small collection of WW2 German medals which included some ID documents and some stamps and I haven't looked back!

What areas do you collect and why?

I started off with Germany and GB, which then evolved into British Commonwealth up to 1970. More recently, I have taken a fancy to Austria, Belgium, Iran and the USA... and quite a few others! The mixture of history, geography and the beauty of the designs of so many stamps mean I am fast becoming a worldwide collector!

What are your favourite stamps?.

My favourite stamps vary from day to day! I love the classic Greek Hermes heads and engraved stamps (pretty much anything by the master engraver Pierre Gandon is stunning!). I also love some of the more recent pop-culture issues that have come out - like the Star Wars stamps from the USA - great fun!
