Church Services Explained (Part 6) Agape Meal by Ruth Orriss

What is it? - It is a Lay-led non-communion service in which we share bread and wine and other food. You will be very welcome and completely included, whether you have been baptised or confirmed or neither. We follow a simple sheet, have readings from the Bible, say prayers and listen to a short talk.

When is it? At 9am, in Weare Church on the 1st Sunday of each month. Usually, no singing and we stay seated around a table. It usually lasts about 30 minutes. At 10am, is a new time and only intermittent for now. More like a normal service with singing, for which we usually stand. It will last around an hour.

Why go to this service? An anonymous attender says. 'The 9am is early in the day and the quietness helps me to focus on the day ahead. The sharing of bread reminds me that we are one family and that the Church Family supports me when I need help. The 10am feels like a normal service without the feeling that I might not belong'. What do I need to do if I want to attend? Just come into the church just before 9am or 10am and take your seat. You will be given a service sheet in your seat. If you would like someone to pick you up or meet you outside, please ring 01934 733281. '

Our alter hanging project is underway with beautiful designs from Serina and George Hatton. If you would like to get involved in transforming the pictures onto fabric please let me know. Our next meeting is at the church on 25th May at 3pm; if you cannot make this day and time and you would like to join in, just contact Claire.

Once again the year is zooming along and this month it will be St John the Baptist day again. There will be a 10am service at the Church to celebrate our Church's special day. Please check the exact date on the back of the Contact magazine. Gift day envelopes will drop through your door and this year I have a special appeal to all villagers.

Please keep our Church bells ringing. In April the bells were checked out for safety and we found they are in need of urgent repair. We can now only ring 3 of the 4 bells. All 4 bells need new fittings and rehanging to make them safe to ring. Richard Purdue from Exeter founded Biddisham bells in the early 1600's. They are a special peel of 4 bells – the only set Richard made. The rest of his works were single bells of which bell 11 in Exeter Cathedral are one of them. From now on we are limited to ringing 3 bells for special services and occasions like weddings. There can only be a ding, dong, ding: not a ding, dong, dong, ding. We need to raise over £10,000 for their repair. And so any donations this gift day will go towards repairing the bells. Please dig deep into your pockets to keep hearing the bells and for the bells to continue to ring for the next 500 years. Claire – Churchwarden

Badgworth

Debra Anderson writes...The bells of St Congar's were rung on Saturday 06 May for the Coronation of King Charles III. A dedicated band of local ringers went around the parish and beyond to ring as many of our bells as possible, beginning at Axbridge, then Biddisham; breaking for a substantial lunch at the New Inn, Cross, and then to Weare, Badgworth, Compton Bishop, Loxton, Christon, and finally on to Uphill. A marathon effort but very well worth it! Many thanks, yet again, to John Dunstone for organising the tour (known as a 'tower grab'!) and ringing as well.

Plea for new Ringers - We still have only two novice ringers from Badgworth to ring our bells, which means that we rely entirely on the good will of local ringers to come to our tower to ring with us. They have been supporting us now for 21 months and we are beginning to struggle to get enough ringers to Badgworth to keep our regular ringing practices going. Our open tower days have been very popular with many people keen to give ringing a try – which is great. Now we need a few more learners, if we are to make a Badgworth band of our own one day and stop relying on others to keep us going. Crook Peak Special Choir - The choir have been kept very busy in April and May. Over Easter they sang at Christon on Good Friday and Easter Sunday when the church was full. On 23 April the choir were joined by singers from Mark and Stone makeover of the hall with a large corner sofa, refurbished Allerton for a special joint service at St Congar's to commemorate four Elizabethan chalices dated 1573, from the villages of Badgworth, Mark, Stone Allerton and Weare. The Reverend Richard Neill, Area Dean, and our lay minister Gary Orriss lead a full church of 92 people in a service which was fascinating and uplifting. After the service, Elizabethan-style church-ales added to the celebratory atmosphere, and the Elizabethan Consort of period recorders, from Axbridge, played Elizabethan dance music. It was a very joyful occasion. The choir's busy schedule was brought to a climatic close with a coronation service at Weare, the day after the King's coronation. Nothing contemplative or reflective about the music on this day – just a blast of the most joyous and optimistic choral songs! Congratulations to the choir, who have worked so hard, learning lots of gorgeous and challenging music and giving up their Monday evenings to attend practices.
