# <u>Top Tots</u>

We began the Top Tots program at the beginning of the year where we were going down to the Talla Dhonaidh Chaimbeul each Tuesday morning for an hour. The children really enjoyed the program. They had plenty opportunity for exercise within the program, jumping, bouncing around etc. helping to develop their physical skills.



We hope to start the program again soon and parents will be informed when we do this.

#### The Weather and Sun Hats

As the weather is getting better, we would like to remind parents to make sure their children are provided with sun hats and sunscreen (where necessary). We do provide sunscreen which is Nivea for children at factor 50+.

The children are now provided with home link leaflets to let their parents know what they have been doing during their session. # <u>Circle Time</u>

Shonagh made up some really nice Boards to use as props for our circle time with the children. We hold short sessions with them each morning (and each afternoon for those who come in after Nursery) This helps to start our day/afternoon by talking about the weather, how the children are feeling, what they would like to do during their session, what they would like for snacks and who is going to be a helper during snack/lunch times.





There are pictures up in the foyer for you to see the children involved in circle time. The children have been enjoying the sessions and they enjoy making their own choices.

#### <u>Garden</u>

Our garden is getting on really well! Thanks to Jimmy Miller and Neil Hannah who built our raised beds, and also Martin from Jewsons who gave us wood and top soil for free. Thanks to Shonnie and Shonagh, the children have planted potatoes, pumpkins, peas and broccoli. We also have lots of flowers growing; some which were kindly donated to us by Dòmhnall Iain (Warden), who works at the College.

The children have been going out every day to water the plants and we hope that when they are ready they can take some vegetables home.

#### **Questionnaires**

We would like to thank those parents who filled in our questionnaires last year. From the 10 that were returned we are pleased to say that all parents either agreed or strongly agreed that they were overall happy with the quality of care their child was receiving. Further to this:

7/10 would like staff to work with them to develop an individual education and support programme for their child.

9/10 would like staff to regularly assess their child's learning and development and use this to plan their next steps

9/10 would like the service to make good use of resources in the community

Some parents indicated that they would like extended opening hours.

Staff training so far:

Kirsten successfully completed a 3 day First Aid course with 'Mountain Medicine' in March. She also completed a 7 day training course (PLIP, Play and Learning into Practise) in June with Himats (Highlands and Islands Accredited Training Services) and CALA (Care and Learning Alliance).

Sileas and Shonagh attended training in Child Protection (Getting if Right for Every Child -GIRFEC) in May this year with CALA.

Sìleas also attended a course in May on 'Encouraging Language Development in Early Childhood Settings' with the Highland Council.

Both staff and members of the Board attended training this month in 'Birth to Three supporting our youngest children'. We would like to thank Louise Gibson, CALA Practice Development Officer for this region for coming to SMO and for presenting this training.
