Planning the Festival

12th October 2010 festival launch at Brown's Field Youth and Community Centre when the dates and theme for 2011 were settled. Finances for the first two Festivals had been hosted by St Andrew's Hall and Chesterton Community Association respectively, it was time for the Festival Committee to become more formal and open its own bank account, create its own logo and invest in new banners.

14th February 2011 Festival Promotion event at Brown's Field with more input from prospective participants to guide the background work of developing the detailed programme.

Cameras were purchased using a grant from Granta Housing to allow children to borrow them and actively participate this year. The response was to triple the number of entries to be judged. The judges were Nick Moir, Ken Turner and Mike Thornton Hundred Houses Society sponsored the event which was organised by Valerie Cutting. Friday 24th June

Concert at Brown's Field Youth and Community Centre: Around 250 people turned up to enjoy performances from High Tory, Run For Cover and the Chesterton Community Choir despite the rain. The concert ran until 9pm with hot dogs, burgers and drinks to fortify the audience.

Saturday 25th June

Community Fun Day on Pye's Recreation Ground in Church Street on a very blustery day which wrecked a number of gazebos. This year we allowed parking on the Rec. but banned any moving of them between 1 and 5 whilst the event was running.

St Andrew's Church was decorated to respond to the festival theme 'A Walk Through Time' with the vicar being kept fully occupied showing people parts of the church that are not normally open to the public. The floral displays were done by the St Andrew's Church Flower Group. Tea, cake and coffee were served in St Andrew's Hall,

Margaret Nimmo-Smith again opened her garden with teas and plants for sale, the proceeds going to local charities. Attendance at all venues during the day was estimated at around 2000 people with around 300 on the Recreation Ground at any one time.

Sunday 26th June

The main event was the open-air United Festival Service held at Chesterton Methodist Church with tea to follow. "A Walk Through Time" trail and quiz led people into places that are not normally open to visitors, including Chesterton Towers, the Old Manor House and the former Parish Hall, now SNAP nursery. At 6pm hardier entrants repaired to the Green Dragon to continue the festivity.

Monday 18th July

Chesterton Choral Society presented "As Time Goes By" a concert of light and familiar songs for a summer evening including Over the Rainbow, Bobby Shafto and Yesterday

Finance

The main funding for the Festival came from the Cambridge City Council North Area Committee Grant supplemented by a grant from Granta Housing Society.
