Chesterton Coronation Committee

This Committee, formed after the death of Oueen Victoria, was set up to celebrate the coronation of the new King. Edward VII's illness caused a postponement until 1902. The Chesterton Committee was composed of people who could contribute usefully both in ideas and material benefits. The Chairman, lack French, was Manciple of Magdalene College and had been Head Porter. He was used to organising groups of people and had responsibility for ordering food and stores. John Bester and William Westley were men of substance and independent means. Francis Whibley, a grocer, could provide provisions; Horace Gray, manufacturer of athletic equipment, might have organised sports; Percy Squires, a furnisher's manager, perhaps provided seating. George Cook, a master plasterer, might have offered labour, while David Williams and his horse-drawn cab perhaps provided any necessary transport. Aged between 34-56 years, they were men in their prime. No

records of Minutes or of quarter of a pound of tea subscriptions to a fund have survived

The Coronation on 9 August 1902 was a day of celebration in Cambridge. Old Chesterton was largely deserted and there were only meagre decorations in its streets. No doubt many residents watched the procession of decorated floats and attended the celebrations on Parker's Piece in the morning. 

Brian Pratt was one of those who rang the bells for the Coronation 49 years ago. He will be there in the tower again on Sunday 3 June (from about 11.15am) as the band of ringers celebrate the lubilee with another quarter peal. St Andrew's are also organising a Jubilee lunch in the Hall on that day and there will also be the chance to stay on to watch the Jubilee river pageant on a large

screen - which will also feature church bells in a starring role. The lead vessel in the flotilla will be a floating belfry with a new set of eight bells that will be installed in the church of St James at Garlickhythe after the event. The bells will be answered and echoed by ringing from the riverbank churches along the route. A jubilee concert will take place on the evening of 9 June.

In honour of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, St Andrew's will be decorated by the Flower Group to commemorate our royal links down the ages.

The centrepiece will be the east window, recently restored and cleaned, which was originally installed in 1897 to commemorate the diamond jubilee of Queen Victoria.

Other features that will be highlighted will include the royal coat of arms of James II (1685-88), a Plantaganet king and queen, two doomed kings (including Mr Punch's ancestor) and Christ the King.


