I am a hard working individual who gives 100% in all aspects of my life. I enjoy leading from the front, whilst being part of a team. I am at present employed as a Lifting Operations Supervisor by an international company, and my work constantly takes me around the globe. I am trained in both instructional and work based assessment techniques to Training and Development lead Body (TDLB) and Management Charter Initiative (MCI) defined criteria. Successful assessment against the performance criteria listed has resulted in my being awarded relevant certification (D32 & D33) by the Scottish Qualifications Authority, and HR 14 and HR 18 by the National Examination Board of Supervisory Management (NEBSM). As part of my ongoing personal development, in July 2007, I attained the V1 qualification (Conduct Internal Quality Assurance of the Assessment Process), and was heavily involved in the company internal competence assurance scheme whilst employed by Sparrows Offshore. In November 2008, I achieved the 5-Day Plant Manager Safety Training course in the CSkills Training Centre in Renfrew, and in June 2009, I achieved the CITB Managers ConstructionSkills Health and Safety Test, followed by the A61 Appointed Person qualification. These three courses I funded myself, such is my enthusiasm for lifting operations, and being involved in this exciting and dynamic industry.

Employment History

June 2009 – Present – Shore Base Supervisor on contract to Hess Oil Company based in Misuratah, Libya. Duties are as described below, with the exception that the cranes are Gottwald dockside cranes – one 63te and one 100te SWL.

July 2008 – April 2009 - Working as Consultant Lifting Supervisor at the Schenker Benghazi Marine Supply Base in Libya. This involved the supervision of all lifting activities on the base, the certification and maintenance of all lifting equipment, and the training and competence of the crane and fork lift operators and lifting crew at the base. Plant that we had on the base ranged from a 250te Kobelco crawler crane, two 60te Terex Bendini RT cranes, five desert specification articulated trucks, two Terberg Tugmasters and four Mafi trailers, and four forklift trucks from three to twelve ton.

June 1982 – July 2008– Sparrows Offshore Services, Denmore Road, Aberdeen AB23 8JW

Duties – Started as crane operator, promoted to Crane Foreman operating and maintaining offshore pedestal and onshore crawler cranes. Promoted to Crane Training Supervisor in 1993, training and assessing internal crane operators, and training and

assessing external company crane operators and banksman/slingers worldwide. This included the development of the competence assurance programme, and the training courses being delivered by the company instructor/assessors. In 2006, my title changed to Lifting Operations Supervisor, with additional responsibilities for Sparrows Training Centre in Aberdeen, including the Internal Verification of all training and assessments conducted by the company trainer/assessors, and the day to day management of the facility. Over the years, I have been assigned to various contracts on and offshore in management capacities, including the UGDC Gas Plant in Port Said, Egypt as consultant with responsibility for some 150 cranes on site, ranging from 20 ton mobile telescopic to a 1000 tonne pedestal crane. Another assignment was to Woodside Energy NA as offshore base co-ordinator/heavy lift specialist in Misuratah, Libya. This assignment was to cover leave periods of the company employee.

1978 – 1982 – Greenham Plant Hire (Heavy Crane Division), Aldridge, England

Duties – Operating and maintaining a range of crawler cranes from 20 tons to 500 tons capacity. These duties took me all round the UK and Eire on civil and energy projects including live gas and oil refineries.

1976 – 1978 – Tarmac Construction, Grangemouth, Scotland

Duties – Crane and plant operator, operating a range of cranes and excavators in various civil engineering sites around Scotland.

1974 – 1976 – Highlands Fabricators, Nigg Bay, Scotland

Duties – Trainee crane and plant operator, operating a variety of plant and cranes on an oil jacket construction yard.
