## Code of conduct For Open water swimming At Bosworth Water Park

All swimmers must sign in before entering the water at the designated entry point.

All swimmers must also sign out when leaving the water at the designated exit point

Swimmers are advised be members of a registered B.T.F. triathlon club .and have or hold a B.T.F. licence

All swimmers must wear a brightly coloured swim cap

All swimmers should look out for each other

It is advised that you never swim alone

All swimmers are aware that they will not behave in a manner that will cause harm or distress to other swimmers.

Any swimmer who may get into difficulties should follow British Triathlon instructions and roll onto their backs try not to panic and shout for assistance.(help) holding one arm up

Swimmers must not enter into the water if feeling unwell or have been drinking alcohol etc.

All swimmers are advised to have B.T.F Licence before signing declaration form

Swimmers may be asked to take a turn to Marshall at some point during the year and sign swimmers in and out of the water.

Swimming is only at the designated swim times by arrangement of the owners of the Bosworth Water Park

I agree that I participate in the stated event(s) entirely at my own risk and that no responsibility whatsoever shall be attached to the organizers or any person, or associates involved in the organization of the event(s) for any injury, accident, (including fatal) loss or damage suffered by me in, or by reason of the event(s) however may be caused.

I declare that I am healthy and have no known medical condition that could make it dangerous for me to take part in any sporting activity. By entering the event(s) you agree to have read and understood the above before entry.

I declare that I do not hold the event organizers or the property owners or associates liable for any loss damage claim or expense that may arise as a consequence of my participation in this event. I am aware that there is not always life guard cover. I am in good health and I am aware of the fitness levels required, and swim at my own risk knowing this.
