Richard is manager of the National Trust for Scotland’s Grey Mare’s Tail nature reserve near Moffat. He will give an overview of the natural history of the area but with a focus on Peregrine Falcons, grazing animals and highlight the implications that has for managing an upland reserve. Richard will also give a brief account of the Geology of the area. The magnificent Grey Mare’s Tail waterfall is the fifth highest in the UK and cascades from Loch Skeen into the Moffat Valley.
