“Hunters, Munchers and Management”

Richard is a ranger with the National Trust for Scotland and he will describe the natural history of the Grey Mare's Tail reserve near Moffat. Richard will give an overview of the area but with a focus on Peregrine Falcons, grazing animals and the implications that has for managing an upland reserve. The magnificent Grey Mare's Tail waterfall is the fifth highest in the UK and cascades from Loch Skeen into the Moffat Valley. Richard will also give a brief account of the Geology of the area.
