Matters Arising 19th June Minute: AS had sent a letter to John Hutchison regarding Redkite (management of Nevis & Glencoe). A letter has been received giving possible dates for a meeting. AS will circulate the dates to the other CC's. AS will send an email to the Forestry Commission with concerns about the A82 Corridor.

Correspondence received: Letter received from the Rotary Club asking us to support a world wide appeal by purchasing crocus bulbs. Giant Purple Crocus dye is used to dab childrens fingers to show they have been immunised against Polio. The Council decided to buy 200 bulbs.

Letter from The Highland Council regarding the Licencing Board.

Council Finances: DS reported that The Highland Council grant had been received. The Community Council funds stand at £1797.27.

Community Company update: The Company had held its AGM and the Board of Directors, Secretary & Treasurer were re-elected.

The Company looked at the Inverrigan Burn to see if there was a possibility of generating electricity. The old water supply could be used to produce electricity, further investigation needs to be carried out.

The Company working group will meet at the end of the summer to discuss GORT.

AOCB:

1. AS reported that there were no bus time tables in the bus shelter. GM to contact City Link.
2. A resident in Lorn Drive had complained that The Highland Council had allowed the trees and grass to grow out of control, causing darkness in the houses,

blocking light from lamposts and generally looking untidy.

A Highland Council representative has visited Lorn Drive and we await the outcome.

3. TJ brought to the attention of the Council road safety for children in the village. There are now markings on the pavement in Lorn Drive and the Village street indicating where children should cross the road. It was felt that more could be done with road markings, warning lights and speed humps to slow vehicles down. TJ to speak to the Head Teacher. The Council will give the school its full support.
