LOOS COMMEMORATION TRIP - OCTOBER 2015

Earlier this year the Queens Own Highlanders Association (QOHA), which is the umbrella Association for The Seaforth Highlanders, Queens Cameron Highlanders Own and The Highlanders, was invited to send a party to help commemorate the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of Loos.

Battalions were amongst those directly involved in the Battle it was decided to accept the invitation which had been extended by the small town of Auchy-les-Mines which is close to the main battle site.

Around 40 individuals travelled to France and amongst them were members of the Crown Church and another whose wife/mother is a Crown stalwart. The sub-group consisted of David Crippin, Bob Shanks and his wife Ann, "Ferg" Ferguson and his son Alistair.

The party set off early on the morning of 8th October and travelled to its base in Lille via Hull and Zeebrugge arriving late morning on 9th October.

After changing into kilts, trews etc the party set off for Auchy-les-Mines and the first of 2 parades. Both were attended by the local Mayor, a lady who took a keen interest in the proceedings.

After the first parade some time was spent in the excellent WW1 exhibition about the battle which the local people had prepared.

This was followed by visits to the site of the Battlefield and the graves of the fallen.

This included the son of Rudyard Kipling, the brother of our late Queen Mother and the grandfather of George Harrison of Beatles fame.

The next day there was a much bigger parade with representatives from the Town, The Royal Regiment of Scotland, The Black Watch Regimental Association and The QOHA Association. The parade wended its way through the town to a site in the outskirts where wreaths were laid on a new memorial. After returning to the local sports hall the QOHA group set off for more visits before returning to its base in Lille.

After breakfast the next day, the party headed back to the ferry but not before having an extended break in the lovely Flemish Town of Ypres with all its many reminders of WW1.

The journey home by ferry and land was uneventful and the coach returned to Cameron Barracks around 20.30hrs on Monday 12th October.

This had been a very thought-provoking trip which amongst other things had allowed David to view the ground over which his grandfather had fought as an officer in the Gordon Highlanders and enabled Ferg and Alistair to fulfil a long held desire to visit the cemetery in which Ferg's grandfather is commemorated.

Please keep Kevin in your prayers as he develops both his conventional church ministry and his use of the arts to reach those outside the church facing difficult situations.




