Conditions

This permit is granted subject to the conditions set out in the particulars of let and to the following:-

1. This permit must be carried at all times when fishing and displayed to authorised persons upon request. Regular checks will be made by the KSDFB Bailiffs on the river. This permit is not transferable except by prior agreement with the estate.
2. By agreement among all proprietors fishing shall be by fly only and of course conducted in a sporting manner. It is recommended that prior to 15 June only single hooks be used, doubles thereafter. No trebles.
3. Under the River Cassley Catch and Release Policy agreed with the Upper proprietors –
Two fish may be retained per rod per week
All fish to be released prior to 15th June.
All other fish must be released in accordance with the NASCO guidelines
All fish over 65 cm must be recorded and released
All coloured, tagged or fin clipped fish must also be recorded and released
All hen fish must be recorded and released in August and September.
4. The permit holder must return Catch and Release form to the Ghillie at the end of the period with a record of fish caught noting the date, time, weight and pool.

The fishings are let subject to the River Cassley Conservation Policy for the protection of salmon stocks and particularly early running multi sea winter fish. The Conservation Policy supports the recommendations of the Kyle of Sutherland District Fishery Board and aims to achieve a 75% release of fish caught over the season.

The Glenrossal fishing is divided into two beats each with three let rods and one house rod. Rods one, two and three start on the Upper with rods four, five and six on the Lower rotating at 1 p.m. lunchtime each day.

Fishing is from Monday – Saturday inclusive.

We would like to remind you that if you have been fishing abroad recently it is essential that you sterilise all your tackle. This is a precautionary measure against disease. The KSDFB rules now make this mandatory on all our rivers.
