James McInroy (1759–1825)	Son of a wadsetter in Moulin, near Pitlochry (Perthshire).	Demerara (1782); partnership formed 1792.	Bought estate of Lude (Perthshire).
George Robertson (1756–99)	Son of the parish minister of Kincardine (Ross-shire).	Grenada (late 1780s); partnership formed 1792.	Four nephews came to Guyana, including George Rainy (below); nieces married Parker and Sandbach.
Charles Stewart Parker (1771–1828)	Son of a Glasgow-born merchant in Norfolk, Virginia; educated in Edinburgh.	Apprentice to Robertson in Grenada, 1789; partnership formed 1792.	Married Margaret Rainy (Creich), niece of G Robertson. Son married Sandbach's daughter.
Samuel Sandbach (1769–1851)	Son of a farmer and innkeeper in Tarporley, Cheshire.	Grenada from 1789; partnership formed 1792.	Married Elizabeth Robertson (Kiltearn), niece of G Robertson. Daughter married Parker's son.
William McBean (d1822)	Son of minor landowner, Tomatin (Inverness-shire).	Partner in Demerara 1803–c1808.	
Phillip Frederick Tinné (1772–1844)	Dutch merchant in Demerara.	Partner from 1813.	Married into family of Rose of Montcoffer (Banff-shire); son married daughter of Sandbach.
George Rainy (c1785–1864)	Son of parish minister of Creich (Sutherland).	Demerara from c1806; later partner.	Sister Margaret married Parker. Bought island of Raasay.

Original partner John Wilson, resident in Berbice. Agent from 1804 for Fraser (Reelig, Inverness-shire) and Lord Seaforth.

H D & J E Baillie	Bristol	Dochfour (Inverness-shire). Related to many Scots who were in Guyana from 1790s.	Involvement in Demerara from c1790 and Berbice from later 1790s.
J Campbell snr	Glasgow		Active in Guyana from early 1790s. Partners in Demerara and Berbice until 1811: Angus and Evan Fraser (Fort William, Inverness-shire).
R Bogle/Bogle, King	Glasgow		Involvement in Guyana after transition to sugar.
C, W & F Shand	Liverpool	Not clear - may be connected to John Shand of Arnhall (Fettercairn).
