Please find enclosed the crime figures for March 2016, which are showing very few crimes having been reported.

These crime figures will be the last ones that I send out.

It is likely that crime figures may not be sent out in the future, however crime figures can be obtained from the Police.uk web site https://www.police.uk/.

Many of you will be aware of the changes that are being made to the neighbourhood policing teams (NPT) within Nottinghamshire.

As from the 4th of April 2016, the Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) are to be the designated point of contact for any local enquiries, rather than the beat manager.

This does not mean that crimes are reported to them, any crime reports should be made through the 101 or 999 system to the force control room.

The PCSOs are now the lead officers with primary responsibility for, amongst other things, intelligence gathering, neighbourhood disputes, ASB problem-solving, vulnerable victims and community engagement. The PCS's will be available for general advice on issues within the community and liaising with local residents, parish councils and neighbourhood watch teams etc.

I understand that I will remain working within the Rushcliffe area, still with the NPT; however my role, along with the other beat managers, will be changing during the next month.

I started as the beat manager based in Keyworth during August 2011 and I have thoroughly enjoyed my time as the main contact within my beat area.

I wish to thank you all for your help, support and interest in the crime that is reported and the work we have done to try and reduce crime.

Certainly with the help from the Neighbourhood watch groups I believe we have made our part of Rushcliffe a safer place to live and we have encouraged and given confidence to residents to be observant and to report suspicious activity. I hope that this work will continue into the future.

All reports of crime should be made by using the 999 or 101 system to report the incident to the force control room. The beat team monitor all calls to the Police involving our area and we attend those incidents that we need to.
