public walk ways

Hurworth has many footpaths that circle and run through our parish, A path that is regularly used without interruption for ten years can be claimed as public. Some paths are permissive, the land owner can and will close them on occasion to keep them private. For example, Rockliffe Hall has given permission for people to walk the loop of the river tees, but it is not a public right of way and is enjoyed by the generosity and permission of the land owner. It is important that footpaths are frequently used by responsible walkers.

The countryside code should be adhered to at all times.

- Please respect the local community and other people using the outdoors. Remember your actions can affect people's lives and livelihoods
- · Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths unless wider access is available
- · Leave no trace of your visit and take your litter home
- · Keep dogs under effective control
- · Plan ahead and be prepared
- · Guard against all risk of fire
- Keep to the public rights of way and permissive paths at all times
- · Leave all livestock, crops and machinery alone
- · Do not pollute water courses, ponds or lakes
- Protect plants and trees at all times
- · Take special care on country roads
- Make no unnecessary noise
