What are the aims of a 'Hurworth Parish Neighbourhood Plan'?

- To replace the Parish Plan written in 2010 with a 'Neighbourhood Plan'.
 This will be a plan, written by the village/parish, to represent how the Parish sees itself developing over the forthcoming years in areas such as: (but not limited to) Housing Development, The Environment, Leisure & Recreation and Roads/Highways issues.
- Community involvement and participation will be at the forefront of this
 process and as such communication of information to all villagers will be
 paramount.
- The plan will be written in conjunction with Darlington Town Council's Local Plan and as such will be approved by a local referendum.
- The creation of the plan will entail a formal period of consultation with all Villagers/Parishioners regarding the content of the plan and its scope.
- The Parish will be formally represented by a Neighbourhood Plan Committee that has been established by the Parish Council and the Chairperson is Parish Councillor David Wood.
- Residents of Hurworth Parish are invited to join the Committee and, once fully established, Committee meetings will be publicised in advance and will be open to full public participation.
- The intention is that the plan becomes part of the Statutory Development Plan. It is a way to influence and inform Darlington Borough Council of local wishes.
- Timescale for completion of the plan is approximately two years (or more) to ensure adequate public engagement and consultation.
