

This week in our section on practical advice to support



your child with Reading and Reading for Pleasure we focus on **Reading recipes**.

Find a simple recipe and have a fun time baking together! Its a good chance for your child to practise reading and following instructions. For younger children, share the recipe with your child before you begin and read out the ingredients to them. Talk about what you need. They can help fetch the ingredients and mix them together, following the instructions you read to them.

For older children, let them read the recipe themselves and follow the instructions; be on hand to offer support where needed and for handling hot things or anything sharp.
