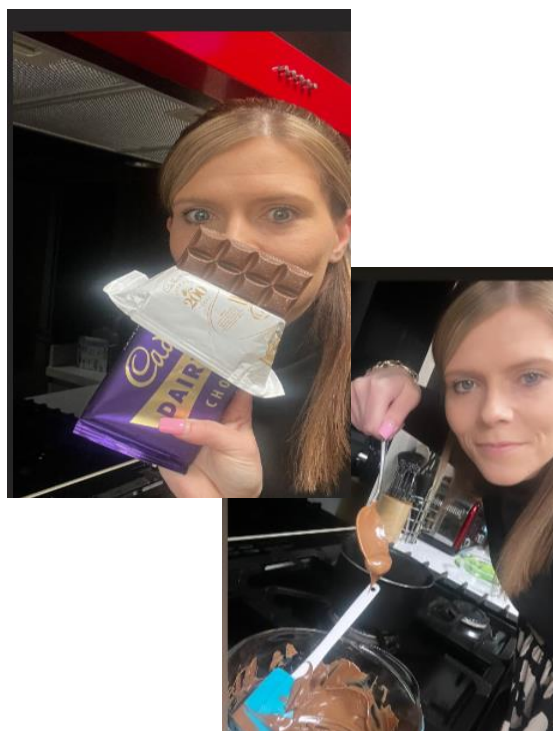
Here's what we got up to...



My Biscuit goes soggy when I dunk it in my tea! The liquid gets absorbed by the biscuit. The hot tea dissolves the sugar, melts the fat and softens the starch grains in the biscuit. I'd better try them all to see which is the better dunker!!

Which is your favourite biscuit to dunk?

I started with a chocolate bar which I know is a solid object because I can't pour it or change its shape unless I break it. I then melted it over boiling hot water (100°C) and it turned into a liquid. Once in liquid form it can be poured. If I put it in the fridge and leave it to cool it will turn back into a solid object. This is known as a reversible change of state.
