Early Life and Family

Anne Frank was a Jewish girl born June 12th 1929 in Frankfurt, Germany to the loving parents, Edith and Otto Frank. She also had a sister called Margot. Anne had a particularly strong relationship with her father, Otto, who was a business man but had previously served in World War One.

Before war began, Anne and her sister had a normal childhood and she enjoyed riding her bike and playing tennis. However, even from an early age, her real passion was writing and telling stories. Like her father, Anne was confident and outgoing, quite the opposite compared to her shy sister Margot.
