Principles of Spending Pupil Premium Grant

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of pupils;
- We make sure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups.
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged;
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals.
- We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged;
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources mean that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

Aims for PPG Spending	
<p>The Leaders and Governors overall aim is to address the barriers to learning. All children are reviewed each term and careful consideration is given to provide additional support, if necessary, to meet the individual needs of all pupils in receipt of the PPG. Support takes many forms as outlined below:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To accelerate progress of disadvantaged pupils to ARE expectations or to meet individual targets in Literacy and Maths. • To provide additional teaching and learning opportunities through trained teaching assistants, teachers or external agencies. • To purchase, where applicable effective materials to support standards in literacy and maths. • To provide support for vulnerable pupils to promote high self-confidence and self-esteem enabling them to become confident learners. • To provide support and guidance for vulnerable pupils and families. • To provide specialised support for staff. • To provide curriculum enhancement opportunities for all PPG pupils.
