Our Learning

Our focus this half term is Our Diverse World.

We have been looking at how different religions believe our world was created this week and thinking about what makes our world so precious.

Next week we will be looking at the Arctic and finding out about all the animals that live there and what makes it such a special place. Our literacy focus will be non-fiction so if you are able to find out an amazing fact about the Arctic or the animals that live there, you can record it on the Seesaw Activity as an additional homework activity. This is optional.

In maths we are looking at how different parts add together to make a whole thing. At home, if you are doing puzzles, please discuss the language of parts and the whole. The children are getting very good at identifying the parts of things and the whole thing they came from.


