

Bierton C of E Primary School Sports Premium Funding 2017-2018

Evidence of impact: July

In the last Academic year, Bierton Primary School received £14,547 to fund improvements in sports, pupils' lifestyles, as well as their physical and emotional well-being. To date, the following amounts of money have been allocated to different areas.

This allows children to have the opportunity to join local leagues in a variety of sports including: football, netball, cross-country and athletics.</p> <p>Through this partnership, we aimed for at least 50% of the school cohort to participate in at least one festival or competition.</p> <p>100% of KS2 children have competed in an Inter-School Competition. All classes up to year 4 (apart from Ash class due to unforeseen circumstances) have participated in a multi-skills event.</p>
