Assessment Week

Last week in school it was assessment week. The children took some assessments in maths, phonics and reading to help inform our end of year assessment (which will be in included on their reports). Once again the children showed a fantastic growth mindset by being focused and resilient during this time and we are very proud of their efforts in a year when they are less familiar with these type of assessments.

Topic Week

This week the children have been exploring their rainforest topic in greater detail. They have looked at the different layers of the rainforest considering what it looks like and what animals would be found there, compared the rainforest to where they live using Google Earth to identify physical features and considered the impact of deforestation. During our research we discovered an ethical search engine called Ecosia that dedicate their profits to planting trees and many children are determined to campaign for families to make the switch. Maths homework set and new spellings (unless still on previous spellings).


Friday 9th July (last homework of the year)-
