#### What is phonics?




## Phonics is a method of teaching children to read by correlating sounds with letters or groups of letters in an alphabetic writing system.

- First we teach the children **ONE** way of reading and spelling the English sounds
- The children are given a hook to help them learn to read and spell the sound pictures which are in the same sound as the letter
- This way, children learn to read and write the sounds really easily
- Within lessons, children then read books and ditties which are closely matched to the sounds they know
- Children do not read books which contain sounds they do not know so that they build confidence and an enjoyment for reading
- Once they can read the initial sounds easily, we then teach them more ways to read the same sound



### Reading books





Once children know all Set 1 sounds and can blend, they can begin to read the Red Ditty books.

PLEASE NOTE: Your child will not bring home a RWI reading book until they are in Red group. They will bring a picture book home and a Library book.





#### How is RWI taught at Bierton?

- Reception children will be assessed when they first come into school, which will form part of their phonics baseline. This will help us to determine at which point your child should enter the RWI programme
- After a half term of phonics lessons, all children will be assessed again
- Based on their assessments, children are grouped and taught in ability groups
- From this point on, children are reassessed every half term to identify progress made and see if any children might require additional intervention
- As a result, groups will frequently change to ensure children are learning at the correct level



#### How can you support your child at home?



- Help us to create a LOVE FOR READING by regularly reading a wide range of books with your child
- Read around the world reward scheme- record in reading records!

Bounce: a-a-a-a-apple Handwrite: Round the apple, down the leaf



Bounce: b-b-b-boot Handwrite: Down the laces to the heel, round the toe



Bounce: c-c-caterpillar Handwrite: Curl around the caterpillar



Bounce: d-d-d-dinosaur Handwrite: Round his bottom, up his tall neck, down to his feet



Bounce: i-i-i-insect Handwrite: Down the body, dot for the head





Bounce: k-k-k-kangaroo Handwrite: Down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg



Stretch: IIIIleg Handwrite: Down the long leg

#### PLEASE don't model in uppercase letters



### Classroom Routines



- \* Gate opens at 8.40am with registration at 8.55am
  - \* Children need a named water bottle
  - \* All clothes need to be named with full name
- \* On PE days, children to come to school in their kit
- Children need to bring their reading book and record every day
- Children will be collected from their classroom doors at the end of the day at 3:15pm



It's the little things...

### Morning drop offs

 First two weeks we will have soft open where you can stay until registration at 8:55am to complete activities with your child

 From Monday 25<sup>th</sup> September you will drop your child at the bear door from 8:40am. A member of staff will be there to escort your child to the classroom

 After half term your child will walk independently from the main brown gate to the bear door where a member of staff will be waiting



#### Lunch time



- All EYFS staff present for first 15 mins to assist with settling down and cutting up food etc
- Children can bring in a packed lunch or have a hot school dinner
- Menu and allergy information on website
- Meals ordered through ParentMail and must be ordered at least 5 days in advance
- You will be added onto ParentMail in September- we can provide food for the first few days
- Children show an adult how much they have eaten before going out to play
- If they have eaten enough, they scrape their own plate and put their cutlery, plate and cup on the table near the kitchen ready to be cleaned- we encourage independence!



#### Purple Mash



- Online platform (also an APP) where homework will be set weekly- this will usually be a Maths or Literacy activity
- Updates and reminders are often sent through ParentMail
- Photos and videos of the children's learning will be sent through Tapestry
- You can add things from home to your child's Tapestry profile
- If you would like to keep photos/images you will need to do a screen shot
- Logins will be sent home in September

### How you can prepare your child for starting school...

- Fine motor skills
- Holding a pencil
- Reading and writing their name
- Reciting numbers forwards and backwards
- Singing number songs
- Enjoying nursery rhymes and stories together and talking about them
- Play 'Let's get dressed' and putting coats on
- Develop their independence
- Tidy up own toys
- Listening games, Simon Says, Pairs, Snap etc...
- Support your child/children to independently toilet
