## Our Learning

Our topic this half term is 'The Great Outdoors', each week we will be learning about the outside world, we started with the theme of weather, the children conducted an experiment to see if we can create rain in a bag and learned about condensation, we check our window to see if the sun has created a rain cloud! Our role play has been transformed to a garden centre where the children have the opportunity to talk about things they might see on sale or use in the garden. Last week World Book day saw some of the older school children come for a visit to read with the nursery children, it was such a lovely experience and

one we hope to make a more frequent occurrence. This week we have been learning about hibernating animals the children have discussed who hibernates and why, they then created an environment for one of the animals discussed in group learning. Our theme next week is all about plants, which ties very nicely into science week where the focus is growth, we will be finding out what plants need to grow by choosing different environments to grow cress seeds. The supporting story is Rapunzel, we will replenish our rather tired herb garden together ready for some sunny weather potion making and think about what else grows, any ideas Rapunzel?
