

Bierton C of E Primary School Sports Premium Funding 2018-2019
Evidence of impact: June

In the last financial year, Bierton Primary School received £18,480 to fund improvements in sports. Although the amount has not been verified yet, it is believed that Bierton School should be allocated a similar quantity for the new financial year. To date, the following amounts of money have been allocated to different areas.

<p>Key indicator 1: The engagement of <u>all</u> pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.</p>		
<p>To increase activity during lunchtimes, breaks and during lesson switchovers.</p>	<p>Whole school enrolment in Fitter Future. This is an online programme, which offers differentiated 10 minutes workouts for all Bierton children. Each child will also have their own personal login and be able to gain access at home where they can complete additional monthly challenges. Children will also be able to create personal challenges and upload themselves completing these workouts to the Bierton user area. Each workout includes three-tier differentiation and can take place inside and outside, as other online activities to be used during daily 'active 30'. Classes have begun to use this programme during different moments of the day.</p> <p>Since being introduced in January, children have accessed the programme at home and in school. Impact and Monitoring

- Use of Funding will be monitored throughout the year to ensure maximum impact and enable our pupils to receive high quality PE and Games.

- Staff will have a greater confidence in planning and delivering high-quality PE. This will come from observations of pupils and staff during PE lessons.
- Impact will be measured against the proposed outcomes, and increased percentage of pupils receiving 'quality provision'.
- Each term, After School and Before School Club Data will be analysed. Measures will be put in place to allow all children to access different clubs.
- An increased number of pupils being signposted to out of school club opportunities.
- Pupil Voice - Feedback from pupils will feature as part of the impact measured showing increased participation and enjoyment in PE lessons and after school clubs. This will come from club registers and feedback from specialist coaches, teachers and children.
- Greater involvement of PE ambassadors and Play leaders in organising inter-house competitions, events and the Sainsbury's School Games.
- By the end of the Academic year, a target of 75% of KS2 children to have participated in at least 1 sporting club.
