<u>Online Safety: Watching Videos:</u> From animals doing funny things, to slime-making and game-tutorials, the internet has lots of fun videos for children to enjoy. However, the amount and availability of content online means that children may see something inappropriate. To understand what type of content might not be suitable and advice on how to help your child watch safely, watch this <u>short video guide</u>. The internet is a public and open space where anyone can post and share content. This can be fun and entertaining for children, but it does mean your child may see something that is intended for adults.

Find out what to do if you're worried your child might see something inappropriate online or what to do if they already have.

Children love to watch videos and YouTube is always a firm favourite! But sometimes children can be exposed to videos that are not meant for them. <u>YouTube Kids</u> is a safer way for children to explore their interests. 
Our Learning


<u>Literacy</u>: This half term our Literacy topic has been Shakespeare and we have been studying the play 'Macbeth'. We have been incredibly impressed with how engaged and enthusiastic the children have been about the text. We have heard lots of children talking about how much they are enjoying the topic and how it has inspired them to read other Shakespeare stories. The lessons have included lots of drama activities and we have also spent time analysing language from the original script.


















<u>Science</u>: In Science, we have learnt about growth and development in animals and humans. The children have explored the changes that occur during the different stages of human development. We were impressed with the maturity of the children during this topic, including the discussions they have had and the questions they have asked about the topic.







Spirituality

Topics for next Half Term:

<u>Literacy:</u> Our Literacy lessons will be based upon 'Cosmic' by Frank Cottrell Boyce. In weekly reading sessions, we will study 'Hidden Figures' by Margot Lee Shetterley.

<u>Science and Topic:</u> Throughout the Spring Term, we will be learning about Space in Science and Topic. As part of this, we have organised a visit to the National Space Centre (in Leicester) in March. A letter containing further information will be sent out via ParentMail. We will also be organising a space themed art and DT day.
