
This half term we have started to learn about Judaism. We have retold the story of Moses and the 10 commandments. In groups, we then used drama to retell the story.





This half term we have started to learn about Judaism. We have retold the story of Moses and the 10 commandments. In groups, we had to arrange the story in order identifying the key theme and events.


