News and Reminders

The children have been working so hard since February half term and we have a busy next few weeks coming up!

<u>Y6 visit to Skern:</u> For those attending our residential to Skern on 22nd May, there will be a kit list going home before the Easter holidays. We will send this in paper form and via parentmail. We will also be meeting with the children in the last week of term to answer any questions they may have and to go through the kit list with them.

<u>Y6 SATS revision packs</u>: Although there is normally no homework over the school holidays we will be sending SATS revision packs home with Y6 children over the Easter holidays. This will be a combination of revision material to read and questions to answer linked to maths and SPaG content. We really encourage the children to complete the activities. Where possible, completing a little each day (little and often) will be most beneficial. The packs will continue to go home between the Easter Holidays and SATS week (W/C 8th May) for children to complete. More information on these will be sent via parentmail nearer to the time.

Reading Challenge: All 3 classes will be completing a reading challenge starting from Monday. Children will have 2 weeks to complete the reading challenge and those who do will benefit from a reward, chosen by each class.

Challenge: Complete and pass 3 reading quizzes on accelerated reader between Monday 13th March and Monday 27th March.

<u>Energize</u>: Some of our Year 5 and 6 children have been rehearsing for a performance at the Wycombe Swan theatre called Energize. They have only had five weeks to learn songs, a dance and be prepared to act in front of a whole audience – a tough deadline but they have been extremely dedicated. This week they attended a full day's rehearsal alongside nine other schools who are taking part and had a great time! <u>Art/DT week:</u> Year 5/6 Art and DT week is the week of 20th March. We are inviting parents in to help with an art project on Tuesday 21st March from 1:45pm to 2:45pm. A parentmail has gone out asking you to complete a form to confirm your attendance. Please can we ask that you complete this form so that we know how many parents to expect. Please note, only one parent per child can attend and we ask that you don't bring siblings.

Homework

The children will be set homework each week on Monday. This should be completed by the following Monday at the latest. Compulsory Homework:

- Weekly arithmetic task set on Purple Mash.
- Weekly SPaG task set on Purple Mash.
- Weekly spelling activity on Spelling Shed. The spelling activity will link to the spelling ladder that your child is on. They need to complete at least 4 games to practise their words. Copies of all of the words are available on Purple Mash.
- Daily reading and quizzing at least once a week on Accelerated Reader. The children can quiz at home using this website: http://ukhosted93.renlearn.co.uk/6703196
- Regular practise on Timetables Rockstars will help to develop your child's fluency of number facts which will increase their confidence in other areas of maths.

As the children are now in Upper Key Stage 2, the homework provided aims to help them prepare for their transition to secondary education. We understand that many children are developing their independence and completing their homework alone. It is often beneficial to look at the homework task with your child once they have completed it. This will help you identify where they may benefit from some support or guidance from an adult at home.

Reminders:

•Homework club is available for any child who would like to complete some of their homework in school or feel that they need some support with it. Children will need to attend homework club the Friday before their homework is due.

<u>Literacy</u>: We have watched 'paperman' which is a short film by Disney. The children have enjoyed the short film clip and have been developing their writing skills, which will be used to produce some narrative writing. So far, they have practised writing complex sentences, repetition for effect and used various synonyms for verbs.

We have also enjoyed spending some time with younger classes reading to each other.



<u>Science</u>: We are continuing to learn about electricity. The children have recently investigated various conductors and insulators, found out what happens when we use different length pencils as resistors and to end our topic, we will be researching different scientists who have made major electrical discoveries. We will present our findings in different ways and end with a presentation to the class.

<u>Spirituality:</u> This half terms Christian value is 'Respect.' We recently had a class assembly on what respect means to us. We talked about the importance of being respectful to our friends, adults and also to ourselves. We then created candles and prayers linked to our new Christian value.





<u>Visit from PC and PCSO:</u> A couple of weeks ago, the year 5/6 children were visited by our local PC and PCSO. They spoke to the children about the importance of internet safety and the use of social media.

Our STEM ambassadors have given their thoughts on the session, "A couple of weeks ago, a PC and PCSO came into the school and talked about online safety. We found it very interesting and I think it made people aware of online dangers and the risks of talking to strangers. They talked about messages on whatsapp and snapchat and games like Roblox or other multi-player games. They said that we have a digital footprint that has all our information and everything we have ever done on a file. Everything will still be there even if you delete it.
