

Swimming Report

As a school, we are required to publish data on the proportion of our Year 6 and Year 5 cohort who are meeting the national curriculum requirements in swimming. These targets consist of being able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes (breast stroke, back stroke and front crawl) and perform safe self-rescue in different water—based situations.

Our current swimming provision

Throughout the academic year, pupils in Year 4 attend swimming lessons at Swimming Pool. Those children who are unable to swim at least 25 metres by the end of Year 4 are given 'top-up' swimming lessons in the following Autumn term.

This ensures that nearly every pupil leaving Bierton Primary can reach the National requirement by the end of Year 6.

Pupils are grouped according to their ability and are taught to:

- Swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- Use a range of strokes effectively (for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke)
- Perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
