
Drums and Guitar



Our Learning

<u>Inclusion Week:</u> At the beginning of this term, we celebrated Inclusion Week and looked at different visible and hidden disabilities and difficulties. The children asked insightful questions and used their research skills to find out more about celebrities with disabilities. We talked a lot about what makes us unique. The children learnt how to do sign language and we had fun signing to each other! We also had the privilege of having visitors come into school - sharing their experiences and answering lots of questions.









<u>Literacy</u>: In Literacy, we have started our first unit on the book from 'The Journey' by Francesca Sanna. We have had the book read to us and experienced some time at the beach (Bierton Beach) similar to the character in the book. We discussed words to describe what we saw, did, smelt and heard during our time at the beach. We came up with some amazing vocabulary!





<u>Maths:</u> We began our Maths learning this half term by looking at place value: understanding the value of digits; ordering and comparing numbers and rounding. Year 5 will be going onto look at addition and subtraction, while Year 6 are going on to look at the four operations. The children learn a range of methods in school and use different representations. Their weekly arithmetic homework may include similar questions so they have opportunities to apply the methods they have learnt at home.

The Queen

We have had lots of conversations this week all about the Queen and looked at the different roles she had. We have all created some pieces of work to remember her. You will have seen some of them hanging by the gates as you come in. Also, have a look at our amazing painted rocks!
