

# 16-19 tuition fund 2021 - 2022

## Rationale

Brighthouse High School will receive £15,360 to provide opportunities for academic catch up for 6<sup>th</sup> Form students following the partial closures of schools and remote learning during the pandemic. £8704 of the funding is based on economic disadvantage and the remaining £6656 is targeted to support students who have not yet achieved a Grade 4 / 5 in GCSE English and/or Maths. In addition, we are carrying forward £178 from last year's 16-19 tuition fund.

## Identification of students

- Post 16 level 3 students who have not yet achieved grade 4 in GCSE Maths.
- Level 2 students on the 6<sup>th</sup> form bridging course who have not yet achieved a grade 4 in English and/or Maths.
- Post 16 level 3 students who come from an economically disadvantaged background and would benefit from some catch-up tuition in one or more of their academic or vocational courses.

## Operational detail of support and tuition

- We have a Maths tutor who is employed on a casual basis. He will provide 1 to 1 or small group (maximum 3 students) tuition on site for 6<sup>th</sup> Form students who still need to achieve a grade 4 in Mathematics.
- We will use some of the tuition fund to pay for extra hours from our own staff to provide extra tuition and support for targeted students.
- External providers will be engaged to provide weekly or intensive tuition where needed.

## Impact

Alongside targeted assessments where appropriate, we will use the scheduled data collections and external assessments to measure the impact of the interventions put into place:
