Introduction

Each school within the Eynsham Partnership Academy has its own Safeguarding policy. This statement outlines the requirements for schools and for the Trust central team. It also outlines the role of Local Authority and the Local Safeguarding Children Board.

Individual School Policies

It is a requirement that all schools in the Eynsham Partnership Academy have their own Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy. A model policy is drawn up by Local Authority and the Local Safeguarding Children Board. This model policy must be adopted by schools and reviewed annually.

The Role of the EPA

The EPA will undertake an external safeguarding review in all its schools at least biennially.

Members of the Eynsham Partnership Academy central team are based in different schools across the Trust. Team members should follow the Safeguarding and Child Protection Policy for the school where they are based, and if they work in more than one school are aware of the differences in implementation of the individual school policies.

All EPA schools will submit the annual safeguarding report to the LA as well as the CEO. The CEO and designated director responsible for safeguarding will review these reports and report to the Directing Board any significant concerns.

The Role of the Local Authority and Local Safeguarding Children Board

Eynsham Partnership Academy are still accountable to the Local Authority. The Local Authority and the Local Safeguarding Children Board update the model safeguarding and child protection policy every September, and this will be used as the basis for the school's policies.

Designated Safeguarding Leads in the Trust



A current list of Designated Safeguarding Leads for the Trust is held by the Company Secretary, if these roles change, it is the responsibility of the Headteacher at each Trust School to inform the person responsible for the statement so that the list may remain up-to-date.
