### St. Anthony's School

You may well be aware that St. Anthony's School in Cinderford have had their funding withdrawn by the government and will be closed at the end of this academic year.

Forest View is currently involved with the local authority to make sure that all the children from the school are placed in suitable schools in the area. As the school has some spare capacity it is likely that many of these children will be placed at Forest View.

Although the school will work hard to minimise the disruption for children it is likely that we will need to increase the number of classes from the current total of 12.

The school may also need to have some minor building work undertaken during the summer holidays to make sure that there is sufficient classroom space to accommodate any extra children we may gain.
