Warning to Candidates

1. You **must** be on time for all your examinations.
2. You **must not** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
3. You **must not**:
 - sit an examination in the name of another candidate;
 - have in your possession any unauthorised material or equipment which might give you an unfair advantage.
4. **Possession of a mobile phone** or other unauthorised material **is breaking the rules**, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.
5. You **must not** talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.
6. You **must** follow the instructions of the invigilator.
7. If you are in any doubt speak to the invigilator.

BEFORE THE EXAMINATIONS

Statement of Entry

- All Candidates receive a statement of entry from school indicating the subjects they are being entered for and the levels of entry, where applicable. Please check that these are correct particularly check that all personal details (date of birth, spelling of names) are accurate as **these will appear on certificates** and it may be difficult to change them once certificates are awarded.
- Some subjects only have one tier of entry; some have Foundation or Higher tiers. Please check that your levels of entry are correct as you are required to sign and return this document to the exam office. If you are unsure about your tier, please speak to your subject teacher.

Examination Boards

- The School uses the following Examination Boards: AQA, Pearson Edexcel, OCR and WJEC (Educas).

Candidate Name

- Candidates are entered under the name format of (Legal) First Name + (Legal) Surname, e.g. Adam Smith.

Candidate Numbers

- Each candidate has a four-digit candidate or exam number. This is the number you will enter on examination papers. It will appear next to your name on your timetable and examination registers. However, there will be a ticket on your exam desk with this information on.

Timetables

- A copy of the school's 2019 GCSE and GCE timetable is included at the back of this booklet. You will also receive an individual timetable showing your own specific examinations with details of date, location, time, and duration of exam. Check it carefully. If you think something is wrong, see Mr Schroder in the Exam Office immediately.
- Very occasionally, there will be a clash on the timetables (where two of your exams are timetabled at the same time). When this happens, the school will make special timetable arrangements. You must check your individual timetable and see Mr Schroder. See FAQ for more information.

Equipment

- It is your responsibility to make sure you have all the correct equipment before your examinations. Have a spare pen and make sure calculators (if allowed) are in working order and do not have a cover.
- Remember you must write in BLACK ink.

DURING THE EXAMINATIONS

Examination Regulations

- A copy of the “Warning to Candidates”, which is issued jointly by all the Examining Boards, is printed at the front of this booklet. All candidates must read this carefully and note that to break any of the examination rules or regulations could lead to disqualification from all subjects. The school must report any breach of regulations to the Awarding Body.

Attendance in Examinations

- Candidates are responsible for checking their own timetable and arriving at school on the correct day and time, properly dressed and equipped. **Candidates must arrive at least 10 minutes** prior to the start time of their examination. Please wait quietly outside your exam room until you are invited to enter by the examination invigilators.

For Exam Hall and G4a– wait outside the sixth form centre behind the lettered row indicators.

For B12 – Outside B12 or inside the lobby area of B12.

For G4a – Outside the room (upstairs in the sixth form block in the silent study room)

Main school hall. In the school foyer (by the trophy cabinets).

B9 – queue outside the external doors that face the AstroTurf.

B33 – outside B33

MFL Block – outside the block.

- Candidates who arrive late for an examination may still be admitted but **may not** receive any additional time. If special consideration applies then you must speak to the Examinations Officer (see ABSENCE FROM EXAMINATIONS).
- Full School Uniform/dress code must be worn by all students attending school for examinations.
- All items of equipment, pens, pencils, mathematical instruments, etc. should be visible to the invigilators at all times. **You must either use a transparent pencil case or clear plastic bag.**
- Only black pens, ink or ballpoint, should be used. Tippex and corrections pens are not allowed.
- For Mathematics and Science exams, students should make sure their calculators conform to the examination regulations. If in doubt, check with your teacher. Remove any covers or instructions and make sure batteries are new.
- Please make sure that any watch alarms are turned off. **Watches should be taken off the wrist and placed on the desk during exams.**
- Do not attempt to communicate with or distract other candidates.
- Examination regulations are very strict regarding items that may be taken into the examination room (see FAQs at the end of this booklet). If you break these rules you will be disqualified from the examination.
- **MOBILE PHONES MUST NOT BE BROUGHT INTO THE EXAMINATION ROOM AND YOU CANNOT LEAVE YOUR PHONES AT THE FRONT OF THE EXAM HALL.** If a mobile phone (or any other type of electronic communication or storage device) is found in your possession during an examination (even if it is turned off) it will be taken from you and a report made to the appropriate exam board. No exceptions can be made.

- No food is allowed in the examination rooms but you will be allowed a **clear plastic bottle of water**.
- Please do not write on the examination desks. This is regarded as vandalism and you will be asked to pay for any damage.
- Do not draw graffiti or write offensive comments on examination papers – if you do the examination board may refuse to accept your paper.

ONCE SEATED

- Listen carefully to instructions and notices read out by the invigilators – there may be amendments to the exam paper that you need to know about.
- Check you have the correct question paper – check the subject, paper and tier of entry. Please put up your hand if you think you may have the wrong exam paper.
- Read all instructions carefully and number your answers clearly.
- Please check the timings carefully. There may be multiple exams going on all with different finish times. Use the **timings** on the front of your paper or check with an invigilator.
- Candidates must stay in the examination room for the duration of the exam. You will **not** be allowed to leave an examination room early. If you have finished the paper use any time remaining to check over your answers and that you have completed your details correctly. If you have finished well before the finish time, check through your paper carefully to ensure you have answered all questions. A very early finish normally indicates you have missed out a question/section.
- At the end of the examination all work must be handed in – remember to cross out any rough work. If you have used more than one answer book or loose sheets of paper ask for a tag to fasten them together in the correct order.
- Invigilators will collect your exam papers before you may leave the room. Absolute silence must be maintained during this time. Remember you are still under examination conditions until you have left the room.
- Question papers, answer booklets and additional paper must NOT be taken from the exam room.
- Remain seated in silence until told to leave the examination room. Please leave the room in silence and show consideration for other candidates who may still be working. Move away from the area as quickly as possible.
- If the **fire alarm** sounds during an examination, the examination invigilators will tell you what to do. Don't panic. If you have to evacuate the room you will be asked to leave **in silence** and in the order in which you are sitting. You will be escorted to a designated assembly point. Leave everything on your desk. You must not attempt to communicate with anyone else during the evacuation. When you return to the exam room do not start writing until the invigilator tells you to. You will be allowed the full working time for the examination and a report will be sent to the awarding body detailing the incident.

Invigilators

- The school employs external invigilators to conduct the examinations. You are expected to behave in a respectful manner towards all invigilators and follow their instructions at all times.
- Subject specialist teachers will normally be present at the start of an examination outside the exam room only.

- Invigilators are in the examination rooms to supervise the conduct of the examination. They will distribute and collect the examination papers, tell candidates when to start and finish the examination, hand out extra writing paper if required and deal with any problems that occur during the examination, for example if a candidate is feeling ill.
- Please note that invigilators cannot discuss the examination paper with you or explain the questions.
- Pupils who are disruptive or behave in an unacceptable manner will be removed from the examination room by invigilators/teaching staff and a report will be sent to the awarding body. This could result in loss of marks for that paper or ultimately disqualification from the subject.

Absence from Exams

- If you experience difficulties during the examination period (e.g. illness, injury, and personal problems) please inform the exam office at the earliest possible point so we can help or advise you.
- Only in 'exceptional circumstances' are candidates allowed special consideration for absence from any part of an examination. It is essential that medical or other appropriate evidence is obtained on the day by you or your parent and given to the Examination Officer without delay in all cases where an application is to be made for special consideration. A self-certification form can be obtained from the Examinations Officer which needs to be countersigned by a doctor.
- For the award of a grade by special consideration, where a student misses part of an examination through illness or personal misfortune, a minimum of 25% of the qualification (including controlled assessment/NEA) must be completed.
- Parents and candidates are reminded that the school will require payment of entry fees should a candidate fail to attend an examination without good reason and without informing the school.
- Please note that misreading the timetable or oversleeping will not be accepted as a satisfactory explanation of absence by any exam board.

Late Arrivals

- If a candidate arrives more than 1 hour after the start time they will be deemed very late. The awarding body will need to be notified and a statement given to ensure the candidate did not access the paper. It is the awarding bodies discretion whether they mark the script or award zero.

AFTER THE EXAMINATIONS

Notification of Results

Results will be available for collection on: **Thursday 15th August (GCE) from 8.30am and Thursday 22nd August (GCSE) from 08.45am onwards.**

- If you wish any other person (including family members) to collect your results on your behalf, they must give the exams office written permission to do so prior to results day.
- Candidates who do not collect their results will receive notification through the post if a stamped, addressed envelope has been left with the Exam Office.
- No results will be given out by telephone or email under any circumstances.

Post Results

Enquiries about Results (EAR)

EARs (re- mark, re moderation and clerical check for GCE papers only) may be requested by centre staff or the candidate following the release of results.

A request for a re-mark or clerical check requires the written consent of the candidate, a request for a re-moderation of internally assessed work may be submitted without the consent of the group of candidates, but can only be requested by the head of department via the exams officer.

If a candidate is to request an EAR then a priority script can be applied for. A Priority script is only available for one week after the release of results and a photo copy or electronic scanned copy will be forwarded soon after. This will enable the candidate and to make a decision regarding a remark. Please note as this maybe within school holidays subject teachers may not be available to mark or advise.

All decisions on whether to make an application for an EAR will be made by candidate and if possible a subject teacher or the head of department.

The cost of EARs will be paid by the candidate. The costs will be included on the post results application forms which will be issued with results.

All processing of EARs will be the responsibility of the Examinations Officer, following the JCQ guidance.

Please note marks and grades can go down following an EAR and candidates should be mindful of this.

Appeals (Post EAR)

Appeals after an EAR (re-mark, re moderation or clerical check) will only be applied for in consultation with the Head teacher. This service is only available once an EAR has been completed and within 7 days after the EAR result has been received. Please be aware that a stage 1 appeal is not directly concerned with the quality of work presented for examination, as this is the responsibility of senior examiners dealing with an EAR. Appeals do not normally involve the further remarking of work, unless it is found that the enquiry about results remarking was not carried out in accordance with accepted procedures. The appeals process is an investigation to ensure that procedures have been correctly applied. As stated in the Ofqual Code of Practice, appeals should focus on whether the awarding body has;

- used procedures that were consistent with the code of practice
- applied its procedures properly and fairly in arriving at judgements

Access to Scripts (ATS)

After the release of results, candidates may ask to request the return of written exam papers up to 28 September.

Centre staff may also request scripts for investigation or for teaching & learning purposes. All scripts requested by the centre staff will be anonymised.

A candidate has the right to instruct their centre not to request their script. In this case please email the exams office.

Re-marks cannot be applied for once an original script has been returned.

Processing of requests for ATS will be the responsibility of Examinations Officer.

Reviews and appeals (Internally assessed)

A candidate has a right to review the marking of an internal examination paper, controlled assessment/coursework or non examined assessment.

Internal Exams (Mocks)

In the first instance, direct application to the Head of the relevant department should be made. The school does not have a formal review procedure for internal exams. However should a pupil feel the need to query the marking, they should make an appointment to speak to their subject teacher. The subject teacher will note the reasons for the candidate seeking a review and based on their reasons may decide to recheck their work.

Where possible a subject teacher may seek a second opinion.

At this stage, verbal or written feedback will be made to the pupil.

Please note that any review of marking can result in marks going down.

GCSE controlled assessments, GCE coursework, GCE and GCSE non-examination assessments

- Please see examination/review policy on the school website.

Post Results Advice

- If you need post-results advice, Herschel Grammar School staff will be available on Results Day.
- Students returning to Herschel in September for sixth form courses are asked to register on Thursday 22nd August (GCSE results day). There will be notices posted advising students where to enrol.
- If you would like your coursework back, please make arrangements with your subject teacher to collect this from school, although it cannot be returned to you until after the October half term.
- Any controlled assessment or coursework not collected by December 2019 will be destroyed.

Book Return Day

You should come to school on the designated day after examinations to return any text books that belong to the school. You will be invoiced for any books that are not returned.

You do not need to wear school uniform. If you are unable to come in on that day you will need to make alternative arrangements with either your head of learning or Mr Devereux.

Presentation of Certificates

- A Presentation Evening will take place in January when current Herschel Grammar students will be able to attend to receive your certificates. Invitations to students and their parents will be sent out with full details nearer the time.
- Students who are unable to attend Presentation Evening will be able to collect their certificates from the school office any time after the Presentation Evening. Certificates will not be given to anyone other than the candidate without the candidate's prior written authorisation.
- Herschel Grammar School is only obliged to keep certificates for a period of one year after issue, after which they could be destroyed. You are therefore urged to collect your certificates on Presentation Evening or as soon as possible thereafter and to keep them safely as your certificates cannot be replaced if they are lost or damaged.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. What do I do if there's a clash on my timetable?

- The school will re-schedule papers internally (on the same day) where there is a clash of subjects. Candidates will normally sit one paper then have a break during which they will be supervised and must not have any communication with other candidates. They will then sit the second subject paper. Correct times should be on your individual candidate timetable. It may be necessary for you to bring a packed lunch if you have exams in the morning and afternoon as you will have to remain in isolation until both examinations are completed. If in doubt consult the Examinations Officer.

Q. What do I do if I think I have the wrong paper?

- Invigilators will ask you to check before the exam starts. If you think something is wrong put your hand up and tells the invigilator immediately.

Q. What do I do if I forget my Candidate Number?

- If you are not sure, ask one of the invigilators who will be able to help you find your number.

Q. What do I do if I forget the school Centre Number?

- The Centre Number is **51407**. It will be clearly displayed at the front of the room.

Q. What do I do if I have an accident or am ill before the exam?

- Inform School as early as possible so we can help or advise you. In the case of an accident that means you are unable to write it may be possible to provide you with a scribe to write your answers but we will need as much prior notice as possible.
- Wherever possible always try to complete your exams, even if you are unwell on the day.
- You may need to obtain medical evidence (from your GP or hospital) if you wish the school to make an appeal for Special Consideration on your behalf (see below).

Q. What is an Appeal for Special Consideration?

- Special Consideration is an adjustment to the marks or grades of a candidate who is eligible for consideration. The allowance for Special Consideration is from 0% (consideration given but addition of marks considered inappropriate) to 5% (reserved for exceptional cases). Parents should be aware that any adjustment is likely to be small and no feedback is ever provided. Candidates will only be eligible for Special Consideration if they have been fully prepared and covered the whole course but performance at the time of the examination (or in the production of coursework) is affected by adverse circumstances beyond their control. Examples of such circumstances may be illness, accident or injury, bereavement, domestic crisis. The Examination Officer must be informed immediately, so that the necessary paperwork can be completed (within 7 days of the last exam session for each subject) and the candidate will be required to provide evidence to support such an application. However no consideration is made for those facing difficulties in the lead up to examinations.

Q. What do I do if I feel ill during the exam?

- Put your hand up and an invigilator will assist you. You should inform an invigilator if you feel ill before or during an exam and you feel this may affect your performance. The invigilation team may try sit you closer to the exit should you need to leave the exam room for medical reasons.

Q. If I'm late can I still sit the examination?

- Yes, provided you are not more than 1 hour late, it may still be possible for you to sit the examination. You should get to school as quickly as possible and report to **Reception**. A member of staff will escort you to the exam room. You must not enter an examination room without permission after an examination has begun. It may not be possible to allow you any extra time if you start the examination late. You should also be aware that if you start the exam more than 1 hour after the published starting time, the school must inform the exam board and it is possible that the Board may decide not to accept your work. Please ensure that you allow enough time to get to school so that if you are delayed (e.g. through transport problems) you will still arrive on time.

Q. If I miss the examination can I take it on another day?

- No. Timetables are regulated by the exam boards and you must attend on the given date and time.

Q. Do I have to wear school uniform?

- Yes. Normal school regulations apply to uniform, hair, jewellery, make-up, etc.

Q. What equipment should I bring for my exams?

- For most exams you should bring at least 2 pens (black ink only).
- For some exams you will need a calculator (Maths/Science), a 30cm ruler (marked with cm and mm), pencil, pencil sharpener and rubber, compasses, protractor, coloured pencil crayons (not gel pens).

- You are responsible for providing your own equipment for examinations. You must not attempt to borrow equipment from another candidate during the examination.

Q. What items are not allowed into the examination room?

- Only material that is listed on question papers (e.g. an anthology) is permitted in the examination room and students who are found to have any material with them that is not allowed will be reported to the appropriate examinations board. In such circumstances, a student would normally be disqualified from the paper or the subject concerned.
- Bags and coats and any other items not permitted under examination regulations must be left outside in the designated area outside. Do not bring any valuables into school with you when you attend for an examination.
- No food, chewing gum or cans/cartons of drink are allowed in the exam room.
- Mobile telephones must not be brought into the exam room even if they are turned off. If you do have a mobile phone on you please store it securely in a locker. Invigilators will not be collecting mobile phones.

Q. Why can't I bring my mobile telephone into the exam room?

- Being in possession of a mobile 'phone (or any other electronic communication device, e.g. ipod, headphones, smart watches etc) is regarded as cheating and is subject to severe penalty from the awarding bodies:

The minimum penalties are as follows:

- Device found on you and turned **ON** - **disqualification for the entire subject award.**
- Device found on you and turned **OFF** – **disqualification from the specific paper** you are sitting at the time.
- Phone rings during the exam **wherever it is in the room** the exam board must be informed and you will be **disqualified from all papers for the subject (including any already taken).**

Q. How do I know how long the exam is?

- The length of the examination is shown in hours and minutes on the front of your examination paper. It is also published on your candidate timetable in minutes (this will include any extra time). Invigilators will tell you when to start and finish the exam. They will write the finish time of the exam on the board at the front of the exam room. Please check the boards carefully as there may be two exams with similar titles e.g. GCE English (GCE refers to A Level examination) and GCSE English. There will be a clock in all examination rooms.

Q. Can I leave the exam early?

- **It is the school's policy not to allow candidates to leave the exam room early, as this is disruptive to other candidates.** A candidate may not leave the examination room without the permission of the invigilators and must be supervised if they wish to return i.e. illness.

Q. What do I do if the fire alarm goes?

- The examination invigilators will tell you what to do. If you have to evacuate the room leave everything on your desk and leave the room in silence. You must not attempt to communicate with any other candidates during the evacuation.

Q. Can I go to the toilet during the exam?

- Toilet breaks will not usually be allowed as it is an expectation that all students arrive ready to sit the examination. If however you are permitted you will be escorted by an invigilator and will not be allowed any extra time.

Q. If I have more than one exam on a day can I get lunch at school?

- Pupils who have examinations in both morning and afternoon sessions may obtain lunch from the dining hall in the usual way or bring a packed lunch.

Q. Why do I need to check the details on the Statement of Entry?

- The details on your Statement of Entry will be used when certificates are printed. If the name or date of birth on your certificates does not match your birth certificate it could cause you problems if you are asked to show your certificates to a potential employer for college/university at some time in the future. You should also check that the subjects and tiers of entry you are entered for are correct and that no subjects are missing.

Q. I am entitled to extra time – how will this affect the way I take my exams?

- Some students receive an allowance of 25% extra time. The invigilators will be informed about whom is entitled to extra time.

Q. What do I do if I don't get the grades I need for 6th form/ college?

- Teaching staff will be available to advise you on results day. If you feel strongly that it is necessary to make an enquiry about your result you should first consult the Head of Subject to obtain their advice as to the advisability of requesting a re-mark. You should be aware that your mark could go down as well as up or even stay the same.
