Study Programmes for September 2019 Year 12 Entry

Introduction

Within this booklet, you will find detailed information covering the Study Programmes offered as part of post-16 learning at Kingsdale Foundation School. It should be read in conjunction with the individual course outlines provided by departments.

Students are strongly advised to consult the course guides carefully before making any choices on their application form. Particular notice needs to be paid to course entry requirements and how subjects link to student aspirations, i.e. higher education and careers.

Please also note that the ability of a course to run is based on the numbers of students who wish to pursue it. Students should also be aware that in some limited situations, timetabling constraints may result in a particular combination of subjects not being possible.

Post-16 Study Programmes

There are three clear Study Programmes to post-16 learning at Kingsdale Foundation School.

These are as follows:

Programme 1 – Baccalaureate

Minimum Entry Requirements – 6 GCSE Grade 7s or equivalent achieved in Year 11.

Please note that individual subjects may require specific grades in particular qualifications to enable study of a designated course.

Programme 2 – Advanced

Minimum Entry Requirements – 6 GCSE Grade 6s or equivalent achieved in Year 11.

Please note that individual subjects may require specific grades in particular qualifications to enable study of a designated course.

Programme 3 – Transition

Minimum Entry Requirements – 5 GCSE Grade 4s or equivalent achieved in Year 11 including a minimum of 3 GCSEs at Grade 5 or above, one of which must be English or Mathematics.



Programme 1 – Baccalaureate

Minimum Entry Requirements – 6 GCSE Grade 7 or equivalent.

Students may take a maximum of three linear A Level courses with an additional linear AS course in Year 12. Students also take the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

At least one subject followed over the two years should be from Mathematics or the Creative and Expressive Arts specialist block although this is not compulsory. Students also follow an enrichment programme which includes the options of the Duke of Edinburgh Award, or Community Service. Programme 2 – Advanced

Minimum Entry Requirements – 6 GCSE Grade 6 or equivalent.

Students will take three linear A Level courses.

At least one subject followed over the two years should be from Mathematics or the Creative and Expressive Arts specialist block, although this is not compulsory. (*Please see above*).

Students also follow an enrichment programme which includes the options of the Duke of Edinburgh Award, or Community Service. Please see our Enrichment Offer booklet, available on our website and from the School Office, for more information.

Pathway 3 – Transition

Minimum Entry Requirements – 5 GCSE Grade D or equivalent with 3 GCSEs at Grade 5, one of which must be English or Mathematics

Minimum Entry Requirements – A minimum of 5 GCSE Grade 4 or equivalent with 3 GCSEs at Grade 5, one of which must be English or Mathematics.

Students study English, Mathematics and Science GCSEs along with other Level 2 subjects. There is clear opportunity for progression onto Level 3 courses at the end of the first year, subject to GCSE grades attained. They also follow an enrichment programme which includes the option of Duke of Edinburgh and Community Service.
