More violent crimes

Lack of officers and funding cuts blamed for spike in figures

Boroughs in South London have seen the highest spike in violent crime in the capital, according to the latest figures from the Met. Southwark and Wandsworth

saw the highest rise in Violence against the Person (VAP) offences, in the 12 months to July this year, compared with the previous year.

VAP crimes include murder, assault with injury, common assault, offensive weapon

possession and grievous bodily harm.

In Wandsworth there was a 10.58 per cent increase, while Southwark saw a 9.39 per cent increase.

In Lambeth and Lewisham, the rise was less than one per cent.

But Lambeth still had the highest number of VAP crimes, 11,768, out of every borough in the capital.

There were 11,359 incidents in Southwark, 9,921 in Lewisham
