Dear Parent/Carer,

Art, Design and Nutrition in Year 9

The Art, Design and Nutrition course is structured to give students opportunities to design and make useful products in a variety of materials. Students will rotate around three key material areas during the year with the scheme of learning being adapted after each rotation to allow for progression. The three material areas are food, art and product design. Students' graphical skills will be developed in some of these modules.

For the work in food lessons we would be grateful for your continuing support in providing the ingredients and container required for each dish produced. Students will be learning skilled food preparation skills and will be designing and making a range of meals that will support them if they do choose to study the subject at GCSE level. Ingredients needed in small quantities such as seasoning, spices, herbs and oil will be provided by school. If students do not bring ingredients to the lesson without a note, then teachers will issue consequences in line with the school BfL procedure. A recipe booklet will be downloadable from Satchel:One and the school website at the start of the module and can be printed by students where needed.

In Art students use an A4 sketchbook issued personally to all students to keep all their work together and collect, experiment and develop their ideas in, alongside work on larger loose sheets of paper. Students will be taught how to use a range of materials and equipment whilst learning about artists, drawing, painting, printing, clay modelling and glazing. Once work has been assessed and celebrated with displays in the art studio and around school, they will be able to take their creations home to keep.

In product design students will use a range of machinery and techniques using woods, metals and laser cutting techniques. Students will document their work in an A3 folder and this will follow them in to the 3 subject areas over the year. In product design students will be designing and making a wooden desk organiser that will be designed to hold a range of items.

If you happen to have any unwanted fabric, art supplies, wood or takeaway containers at home then please do send them in to the department, as these are always needed and will be used resourcefully throughout projects.

To help cover the costs involved for outcomes produced in resistant materials and textiles we are asking for a contribution of £12.00. This would cover the whole range of different items produced during the year and enable the items produced to be taken home. Ingredients and a container are still required for food lessons, though this contribution will support the purchase of ingredients used in smaller quantities as mentioned above.

To help us plan and resource our curriculum effectively and to ensure all parents/carers have received this communication, it is essential that we receive a response for every student.
