Emergency evacuation due to fire etc. Cleaning is not sufficiently comprehensive. Contractors, deliveries and visitors increase the risk of infection.





The sole purpose of this risk assessment is to support schools in <u>reducing the risk of coronavirus transmission</u>. The risk assessment has been written in collaboration with a number of local authorities.

- For the purpose of this risk assessment, the term 'coronavirus' to refer to coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

 Schools must ensure that this risk assessment reflects the local setting and context of the school. Staff must be consulted with regard to this risk assessment (this must take into consideration all types of workers including agency workers, casual staff and contractors and any other adult on site as well as your permanent staff).
