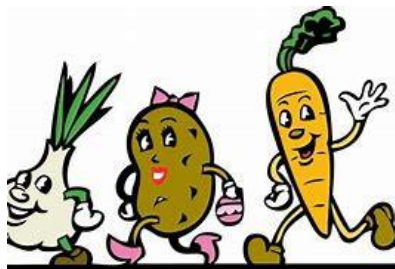

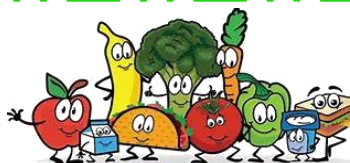
Please may we remind you that all meals required from the School Kitchen must be ordered in advance of the day they are required via Scopay (the online ordering system).
