Cashless Catering Alerts

- Select alerts on the top bar.
- Click on the link to subscribe to the Alerts service.
- Select emails and click confirm.
- Click on 'click here to configure your alerts'.
- Place a tick in the box to receive alerts when your child's balance drops below a certain balance.
- Enter the amount in the box so that you are sent an alert when the balance drops below this amount.
- Click on update at the bottom of the page.

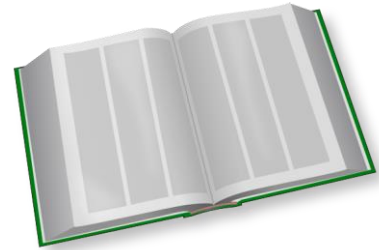
Hairy Fairy Tails
