Peters Hill Primary School was established in 1975 and is part of Dudley Local Authority. The school was originally built as a two-form entry but has now grown to become a vibrant four form entry that is the largest primary school in the borough. We have the capacity for 840 pupils from Reception to Year 1 with a further 45 pupils within our Nursery.

The school is situated on the edge of Stourbridge and Brierley Hill in a pleasant, residential area. The catchment area is wide with many parents choosing to send their children to Peters Hill despite passing other schools along the way. Our Nursery is housed in the previous children's centre building and is a stunning facility for children to receive their early education. This building is situated away from the main school and is linked by playgrounds so that children feel part of the school family. The school is set in its own extensive grounds with playgrounds, fields, gardens, forest school areas and many more outdoor learning spaces. Our most recent edition is the 4G floodlit sports pitch that offers a fantastic facility to keep sport and physical education running all year long.

Within the school we have a large team of staff and a significant number of different teams with different areas of responsibility. This includes teachers, curriculum teams, classroom assistants, office staff, site staff, nurture and safeguarding teams, dinner supervisors and kitchen staff. We run regular nurture support groups through our learning mentor to meet the emotional and wellbeing needs of pupils as they grow, develop and progress. This support is offered through our nurture room facility. We also have a speech and language assistant who supports the early development of language. Our Governing body are a highly skilled and experienced group of individuals who work as a team to provide strategic leadership and challenge to all areas of school improvement. They are heavily invested in pupil wellbeing and academic outcomes and care about the progress that each child makes across all areas.

Peters Hill also works in partnership with RB Active Care who provide before and after school wraparound care for pupils. We are proud of the partnerships we have with many local schools, networks and providers who all contribute to making Peters Hill a fantastic place to thrive.

Peters Hill is an ambitious school where pupil care is at the centre of all that we do. Our whole school values are for children to experience and understand 'Ambition, Belief, Compassion, Pride and Respect'. Our aim is for all children to flourish during their time with us and to fulfil the limitless potential they have. We are proud of our school and proud of the strong community spirit that exists within it.

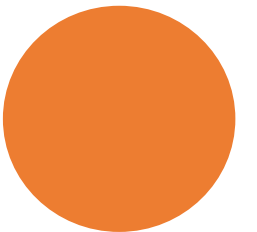

Learning at Peters Hill

Innovative Technology



At Peters Hill, our Computing curriculum strives towards the following aims:

- To make concepts, hardware and software engaging and accessible to the pupils and enable them to progress.
- To develop a good grasp of the architecture of the subject, its key concepts and big ideas. These are the concepts and ideas that are used to create the computing vision and are essential to effective teaching.
- Make these concepts transparent and help children to think logically and to develop transferable computing understanding.
- To take children beyond learning a set of isolated facts and move them into the realms of informed thinking through a clearly linked approach to teaching.

We believe that in Computing, all children should:

- Deepen their understanding of programming and debugging.
- Develop their ability to collect and present data.
- Learn a variety of artistic and communicative media.
- Understand how to stay safe on the internet and develop a responsible use of technology.

To support our curriculum, our pupils have access to a wide range of hardware and software. This includes a range of apple and android devices. The children also incorporate technology across the curriculum through the use of green screen technology, hand held recording devices, chromebooks and sensors.

Our curriculum also includes the opportunity for pupils to take part in a year group technology week where projects are planned that encourage the autonomous use of a range of technologies.

All pupils access technology through RM Unify.

Accelerated Reader

- Accelerated Reader is a whole class management and monitoring programme that aims to foster independent reading in pupils.
- It is currently the most popular reading practice software in UK schools. Developed by Renaissance Learning, it allows teachers to monitor the reading development and practices of their pupils, and provides tools to quickly ascertain their reading level, reading age and comprehension level.
- Pupils read a book, take an online quiz and get immediate feedback. They are aided in their selection of the next book by the monitoring software which will guide the level of difficulty for their choice.
- The programme encourages pupils to read independently and more importantly at their own pace and level. School has a range of books at each level, in order to support pupils' choices.
- Renaissance Learning assess and assign an AR Book level and book points to each of thousands of newly published books each year.
- School, pupil and parents can look up the Accelerated Reader Level of individual books using the online AR Bookfinder.
- Children from Year 2 to 6 all have access to Accelerated Reader throughout the academic year.



Our Central Library

- Not only do we have Accelerated Reader Libraries in each classroom, but we also have a well stocked central library.
- Pupils have access to weekly Library visits and are encouraged to borrow a book to take home and enjoy.
- We are stocked with a wide range of titles and genres.
- This fantastic facility supports our commitment to ensuring that all children grow up enjoying reading and developing a love of books.

Sport Provision

Physical Education at Peters Hill aims to make sport and physical activity accessible for all and enable them to progress, be motivated and increase participation.

The teaching of PE should allow children to develop a joy of physical activity, an understanding of the body, achieve personal challenges and learn to work individually or as a team.

Teachers demonstrate a good knowledge of health, physical education and wellness ensuring all children will be physically active for the entire lesson.

Teachers provide equipment within every lesson for children to practise and refine skills. Opportunities are developed for children to transfer skills from sport to sport. Mastery of skills is achieved through linking skills to a variety of sports.

Our sport provision encourages pupils to work effectively as a team show great sportsmanship and encouragement of others.

We have a range of resources available to set the highest of expectations. This includes a large 4G pitch that enables us to hold a range of sporting activities throughout the year and to ensure that we maximise every opportunity for learning in PE.



Behaviour and Values

We are proud of the positive behaviour and fantastic attitudes that children show on a daily basis.

At Peters Hill we believe in a positive and inclusive approach to managing behaviour. We celebrate and reward our children using the online Class Dojo reward system.

We also hold weekly celebration assemblies to share the amazing things that pupils are doing in and out of school.

Children are very much part of the process, even down to creating the rewards they would like to see as part of the whole school reward system.

We believe in sharing our expectations clearly with all stakeholders through our 'Behaviour Response Chart' and 'Behaviour Expectations Grid. These help us all to be clear on the types of behaviour that we can expect to see and to show what will be rewarded and what will be sanctioned.

We also value the partnership we have with parents and feel that they should be fully included in both celebratory moments and at times where behaviour support might be needed.

Staff model positive behaviour and pupils are encouraged to make responsible choices.

We have a 'hub' built around the principles of restorative practice. Pupils are able to access this space for support with behaviour, attitudes to learning and well-being. This work is provided by our Learning Mentor and is crucial to our pupils development.

Our core values of 'Ambition, Belief, Compassion, Pride and Respect' are what we want all children to demonstrate during their time at Peters Hill.



Safeguarding

Safeguarding

- We take our safeguarding responsibilities seriously.
- The safety and well being of the children in our care is our top priority.
- We have a large team of designated safeguarding leads including a full-time safeguarding officer.
- We have a commitment to ensuring that our practice is the best it can be and is informed by changes in national guidance.
- We commit significant resources to ensuring that policies and procedures are in place to safeguard our families.
- We understand our responsibilities in dealing with safeguarding issues, providing advice and support to staff, liaising with the Local Authority, and working with a range of other agencies.

Enrichment

The curriculum at Peters Hill is aimed at developing the whole child. We believe that education is more than just mastering English and maths – it is also about activities that extend children's learning through new experiences and opportunities.

Enrichment opportunities in Peters Hill include:

- Lunchtime and after-school clubs like chess, computing, art or sport
- Music lessons and opportunities to use musical talents, for example in choir – both practising and performing
- School plays, shows, assemblies and sports days
- Educational trips and residential visits
- Forest School and other outdoor learning opportunities
- Whole-school events like World Book Day, Take One Picture and Science Week
- Supporting charities through activities like food bank collections and mufti days
- Working on a school newspaper, radio show or podcast
- Bikeability and/or scooter training
- Visiting speakers, for example authors, local figures or parents who have skills or expertise to share
- Local or national challenges like maths or engineering competitions
- Being active in the local community, such as through litter picks, river/canal surveys, or carol singing in elderly care homes

Pastoral Support

- At Peters Hill, we have a strong tradition of pastoral support for our pupils.
- We feel that the provision a school makes to ensure the physical and emotional welfare of pupil is of the utmost importance. It is the essential foundation upon which learning can take place.
- We believe in offering high standards of pastoral care and we go far further than a basic commitment to welfare, with pastoral care extending to every aspect of school life in order to foster pupils' personal development as much as their academic progress.
- Good pastoral care in school is also fundamental to the development of character and social skills, which will be of critical importance to pupils in later life.
- We have a detailed Personal, Social, Health and Economic curriculum that responds to pupils needs as they grow and develop.
- We also have a Nurture Room and a Wellbeing room with highly trained and experienced pastoral staff supporting pupils in a range of creative and effective ways.



Inclusion

- At Peters Hill we believe an inclusive approach is paramount to the success of all, this approach ensures all children have access to a broad and balanced curriculum. All work will be differentiated to suit the needs of all of our learners and all children with SEND will be inclusively educated at their individual level of need.
- We operate on the basis that we welcome and value all external support from other agencies to support our children with SEND.
- There is no discrimination at Peters Hill regarding engagement in activities that are available to all of the children. All children regardless of ability are given the same opportunity to engage in any activities within the school day or extra-curricular activities. If a child with SEND requires additional support to access these activities, suitable adaptations and differentiation will be provided to them to allow full participation.
- Our inclusion team includes a SENCO and a speech and language assistant. The team work closely with teaching and support staff including the pastoral teams to ensure that children maximise the progress they make. We also have a close partnership with a range of outside agencies who offer support and guidance to meet children's needs.
- We also have an inclusion hub as an allocated space for children to access that is outside of the classroom environment. This is a versatile and flexible environment that can be adapted to meet the needs of individuals across the school.

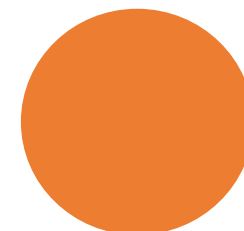

Parent Partnership



- We believe in positive partnerships between home and school. Parents and Carers should be integral to the learning journey of any child and will always be welcomed in to Peters Hill.
- In Nursery there is a daily opportunity for you to share in your child's learning for 30 minutes each morning through 'Learning Agreement Time.' You can work through activities planned by the staff with your child and share their classroom experience throughout that crucial first year.
- Across the school we also offer an annual opportunity to join in with lessons with your child. Each year group has a performance that parents are invited to and a sports day.
- We encourage parents to log onto the class blogs which are regularly updated, this is a great way for them to find out what has been happening in class.
- Our website also has a current calendar of events so parents can stay organised. On the website you can find termly curriculum overviews so you can see what the curriculum focus is for your child in every subject.
- We use Instagram across the school to celebrate the exciting and special things that happen in our school and a fortnightly newsletter is sent out directly to you via email.
- We use a group text and email messaging facility if we ever need to quickly get a message to parents so it's really important we always have your current mobile phone number and email address. The trusty old letters in book bags is another way we communicate information to parents.
- Twice a year parents are invited to a parents evening for a personal consultation with your child's teacher. Appointments are booked online and a letter before the event guides parents in how to do this. In the summer term we invite parents to a less formal open evening where you can discuss with the teacher the written end of year report should they wish, look at their child's work over the year and meet their new teacher for September.
- Throughout the year parents are invited to various information evenings as and when they are necessary for their child, e.g. – Year 2 and Year 6 SATs, Year 1 Phonics, Year 4 and Year 6 residential opportunities.
- We believe in clear communication between home and school. Each class has an email address that parents can use to contact the teacher. We also have the whole school 'enquiries@' email address that can be used.
