Sports premium and PE spend for Peters Hill Primary School

The Government's Primary School Sport Premium has been providing "ring fenced" funding to schools to enable them to improve the delivery of Physical Education.

This has enabled schools to use the funding for example to:

- hire specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers during PE lessons.
- support and involve the least active children by running after-school sports clubs and holiday clubs.
- provide resources and training courses in PE and sport for teachers.
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games.
- run sports activities with other schools.

How we plan on spending our 2019-2020 allocation during the academic year...

Peters Hill Action Plan: Priorities.

Priority 1: To provide additional provision for swimming activity over and above the national requirements (for children not meeting the expected standard).

Intention:

Aside from the **£3392 (swimming for year 3 children)** and **£2440 (transport to swimming)** spent separately on swimming lessons for year 3 children during this coming academic year, Peters Hill would like to increase the percentage of children who can independently swim 25M by the end of year six.

To do this, a budget of **£400 plus £300 transport costs** would enable up to 30 reluctant swimmers from year 6 a chance to achieve this target. 5 x 1 hour swimming lessons would be designed in association with 'Crystal Leisure Centre' in Stourbridge to enable the chosen children the chance of achieving the three intended outcomes listed below.

Total for all swimming across school during 2019/20: **£6,532.00**

Intended Outcome

There are three outcomes we endeavour to achieve by offering additional swimming provision above and beyond the sessions offered earlier in KS2:

- For all children to leave KS2 able to swim 25M competently and independently.
- For all children to leave KS2 able to swim 25M competently and independently using a range of strokes.
- For all children to leave KS2 able to safely evacuate themselves from the water in an emergency.

Priority 2: To ensure 15% of the non-active population are participating in extracurricular provision.

Intention:

'Ace Coaching LTD' have been employed by the school five days a week during the lunchtime period (this total is 10 hours a week).



The coaches will be delivering 20-minute sessions across a variety of sports and skills. The coaches will work with all year groups throughout the academic year, from reception through to year six. A variety of children will be selected to take part from a variety of backgrounds.

The engagement and enjoyment of the activities are vital as many of those taking part have been identified as children from the 'least active population'. This means that in the previous academic year, these children did not take part in an extracurricular activity and claim not to do so outside of school. This is something as a school, we would like to improve during 2019/20.

It is expected that 'ACE coaching LTD' will tailor the sport of choice to link with whichever sport is coming up on the school games competition calendar. This is so that children selected would have had a prior experience in playing that sport and therefore can take advantage fully of the competitive scenarios.

Some of the children attending the lunchtime sessions will gain skills which will enable them to lead activities and warm-ups during PE lessons. This will further enhance Peters Hill's ability to achieve the 'School games gold mark' at the end of the academic year but also adds sustainability to the school if children can pass on key skills to others during PE lessons.

Intended Outcome

During 2017-2018, 25.1% of children identified as being from the non-active population, took part in an extra-curricular activity. The intention was that would increase by the end of 2018-2019 academic year because of our working partnership with 'ACE coaching'. In truth, 28.5% of children from the non-active population took part in an extracurricular activity during 2018/19. The intended outcome for 2019/20 is that the percentage of children from the non-active population involved in an extracurricular activity would increase again to **30%**.

Priority 3: To ensure 50% of pupils are participating in extracurricular sporting activity, across at least one half term.

Intention:

70% of children across the whole school attended an extra-curricular activity provided by Peters Hill and our providers, during the 2018-19 academic year.

During the 2017-2018 academic year, a peak of 43.1% of KS2 children took part in a sporting before or after school club. During the 2018-2019 academic year we increased this statistic to 47.4%.



To ensure we hit 50%, Peters Hill will continue to offer a wide range of before and after school sporting activities. In September 2019, a questionnaire was put to all KS2 children, to discover which sporting activities they took part in during 2018-19. The results of the questionnaire enabled the PE team to decide which clubs should continue, which clubs should be offered to more pupils and which clubs could be added to the extensive list; that previously have not been offered at Peters Hill.

Below you will see a list of clubs offered at Peters Hill, and information regarding whether it has been held before, or whether it is a new initiative:

- Before school 'Rise and shine' club. (Offered to all children free of charge- paid for by the sport premium funding, as was also the case in 2017-18 and 2018-19).
- Netball club
- Cheerleading club
- Dance club
- Basket and net skills club
- Invasion games club
- Mini Olympics club
- Tag rugby club.
- Fencing club
- Multi-skills club.
- Football club and year 6 football team
- Tennis club
- Athletics and cross country

The total cost of 'ACE coaching' services for priorities 3 and 4 is projected at **£5,580 and £2,850**

Intended Outcome

50% of pupils will be participating in extracurricular sporting activity, across at least one-half term. To improve the attendance across school of the before school 'Rise and Shine club'.

To ensure the coaching in the sessions reflects upcoming competitions.

To ensure that the PE team within school are happy with the quality of the coaching delivered from 'ACE Coaching LTD'.



Priority 4: To ensure PH enter at least 6 inter competitions, including 3 b teams and 1 c team.

Intention:

Peters Hill Primary school have again formed a link with the Windsor Academy and will compete in a variety of 'school games' competitions. Our intention this academic year is to enter the full quota of teams into every single activity offered.

During 2017-2018 a variety of staff members took teams of children to various 'school games', including:

- Tennis
- Tri golf
- Tag rugby
- Netball
- Cricket

Figures from 2017-2018 indicate that Peters Hill attended 11 'school games', of which we entered B teams in 3 of them and a C team in 1 of them.

During the 2018-2019 academic year we entered 15 'school games' events and ensured 3 B teams and 1 C team were included.

We intend to ensure that 'Ace Coaching' are aware of our 'school games' schedule so that the lunchtime activities can be targeted towards certain sports at certain times in the year.

This is also an opportunity to take children from the 'least active population' to inter-school events during the school day.

A budget of **£75 and £2180** has been set aside for entry fees and transport to the events above.

Intended impact:

The percentage of children taking part in activities that represent the school through community events or competitions will have significantly increased.

Children will be asked to feedback from each competition based on enjoyment levels and skills gained through attending.



School sports kits purchased in 2017-18 to be used to give children an identity at each competition and to promote the entry of our school into sports competitions on a larger scale.

Priority 5: To develop staff CPD across school.

Intention:

A survey will be completed by staff in Autumn 2019 asked about their interests in areas of PE and as to what areas of PE they would like/need CPD in.

Teachers should request appropriate PE CPD, and if granted, be able to return from that CPD and be able to inform other staff members in the same phase/year group about the course attended.

CPD can also be requested at any point from staff who feel they may benefit with costs of attendance to be discussed and implemented as and when needed.

Intended Impact:

Monitoring of the quality of teaching and learning in PE will capture the developments made by all staff attending CPD and the wider impact of this.

Priority 6: To ensure 15% of children participate in a sports leadership program.

Intention:

The PE team in school will be running a sports leadership programme during the academic year 2019-20.

Children will complete activities and targets in relation to sport and PE.

Children across KS2 will be part of the sports leadership programme which aims to enable the selected children to begin leading activities during PE lessons such as the warm up and the cool down. These children can also lease with 'ACE Coaching LTD' during lunchtime slots, so that they can gain basic coaching skills.

Intended Impact:

15% of children in KS2 participate in a sports leadership program. Children to be identified by class teachers.



Priority 7: To create 5 active links with local community and leisure providers.

Intention:

At Peters Hill, we encourage all children to take part in a sporting club outside of school. To do this during 2019-20, we encourage local community sports clubs and leisure providers to come into school and:

- Hold assemblies promoting their club.
- Give taster sessions to targeted children/classes/year groups
- Distribute advertising/letters for attending their clubs

There is no cost involved for this priority.

During 2018-19, we linked up with 'ACE coaching', 'Hagley golf', 'Worcestershire cricket', 'leap trampolining' and 'Old Halesonians RFC'.

As we progress through 2019-20, this document will be uploaded with the names of links made.

Intended impact:

To create 5 new active links with local community and leisure providers will be achieved with children identifying activities in the community that they can attend.

To continue to link in a variety of ways with those providers who assisted us during 2018-19.

Additional budgeted spends during 2019/20:

- Sports day medals for summer 2020: £235.00
- Sports premium time allocated to AN: £235.00
