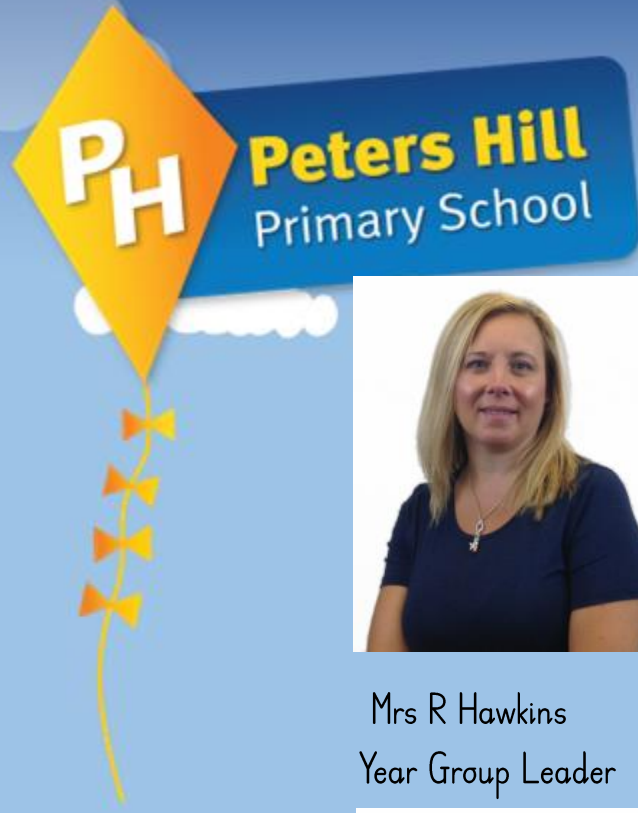

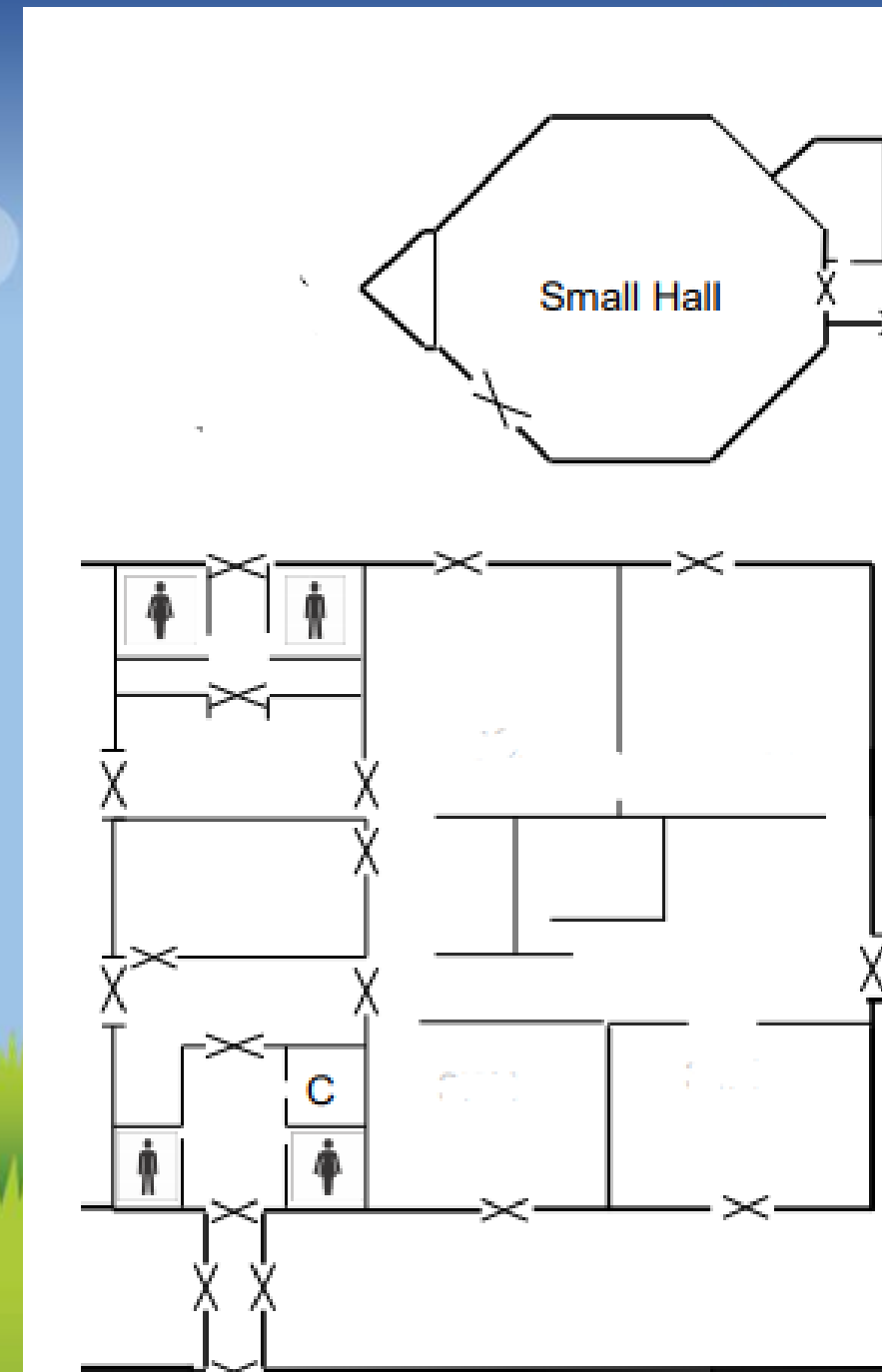

Entrance and Exits

Your children need to come into school via their class external door between 8.35 and 8.45. Here they will be greeted by their class teacher.

Tuck and water bottles

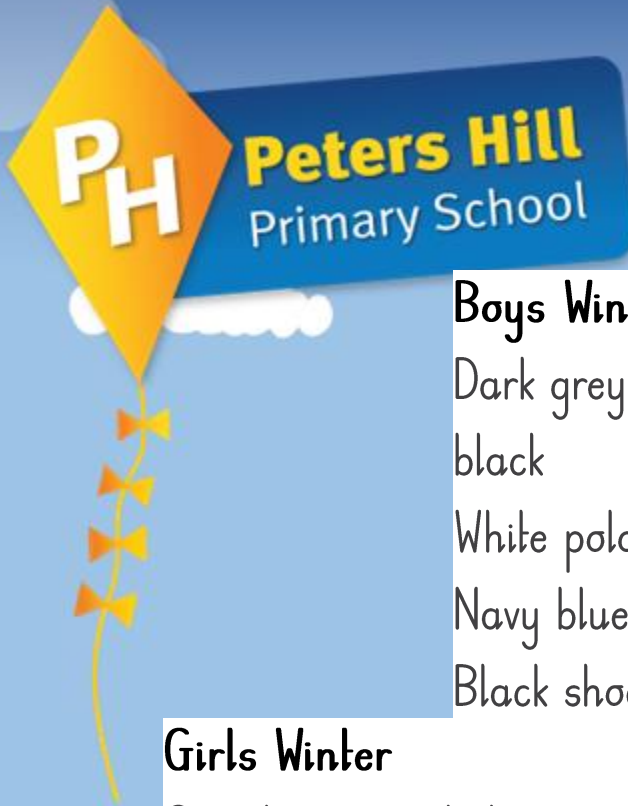
As your child moves into Year 3 they need to bring their own morning snack into school with them, which they will eat at playtime.

We ask that they bring in a healthy snack such as fruit as we are a health promoting school. It is important that no snack is brought into school that contains nuts as there are children with severe nut allergies.

We are a nut free school.

Children also need to bring a named water bottle, filled with water only, into school. We encourage children to drink throughout the day and they can fill their bottles regularly.

Black or white shoes/sandals (plain and flat heeled). **We strongly recommend no jelly shoes or open toed sandals during warmer weather.**

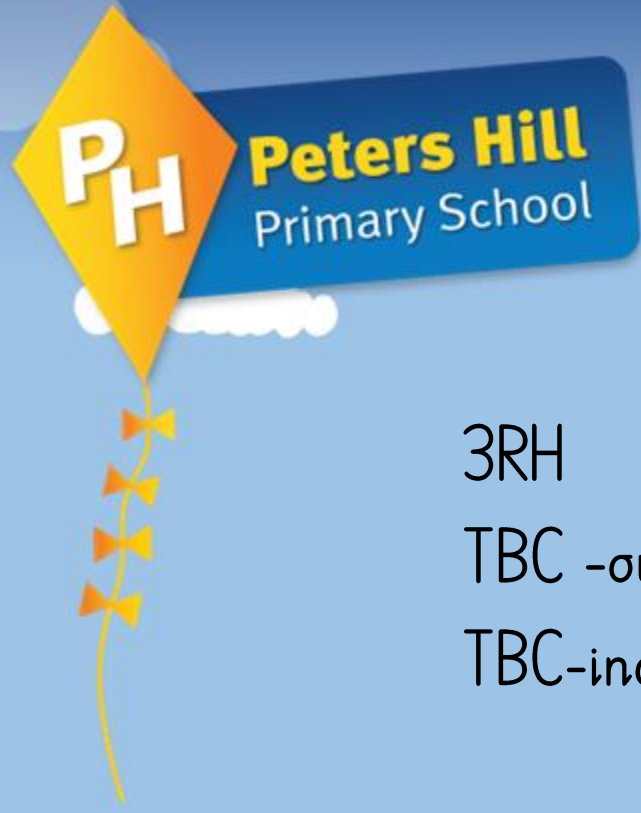


PE Kit

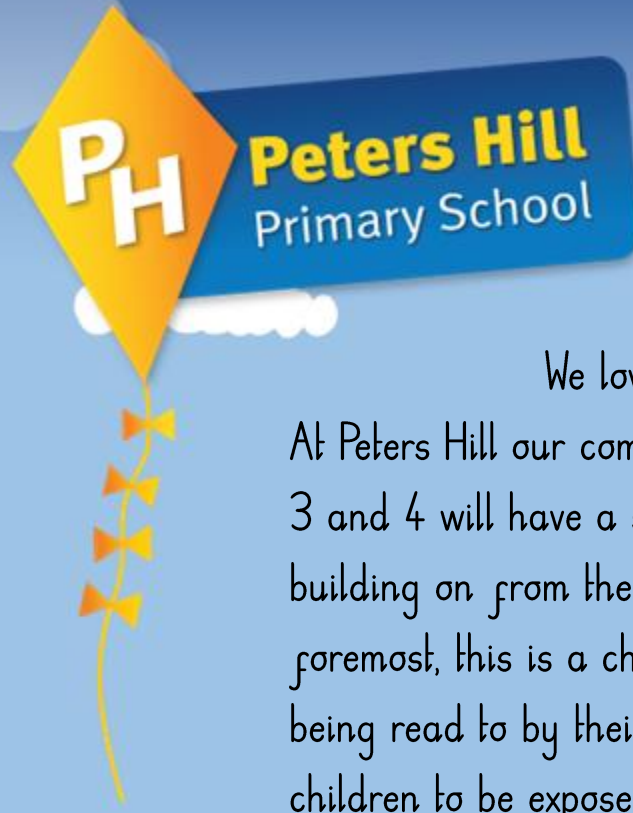
Reading

When your child brings books home spend time enjoying the books with them. Find out which books interest them and ask them questions about the books to develop their understanding. It is really important to read with your child every day.

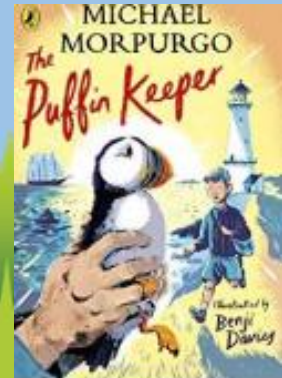
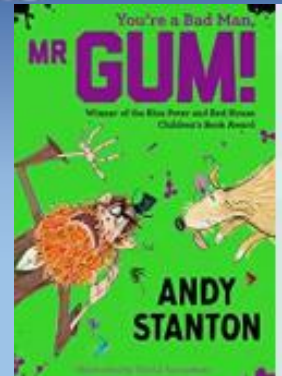
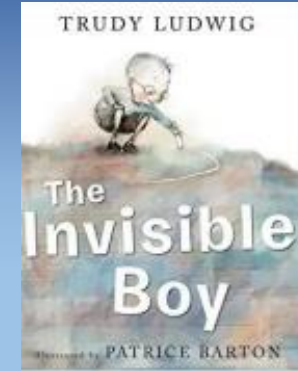




Reading Year 3 Story Texts

We love to read in Year 3!

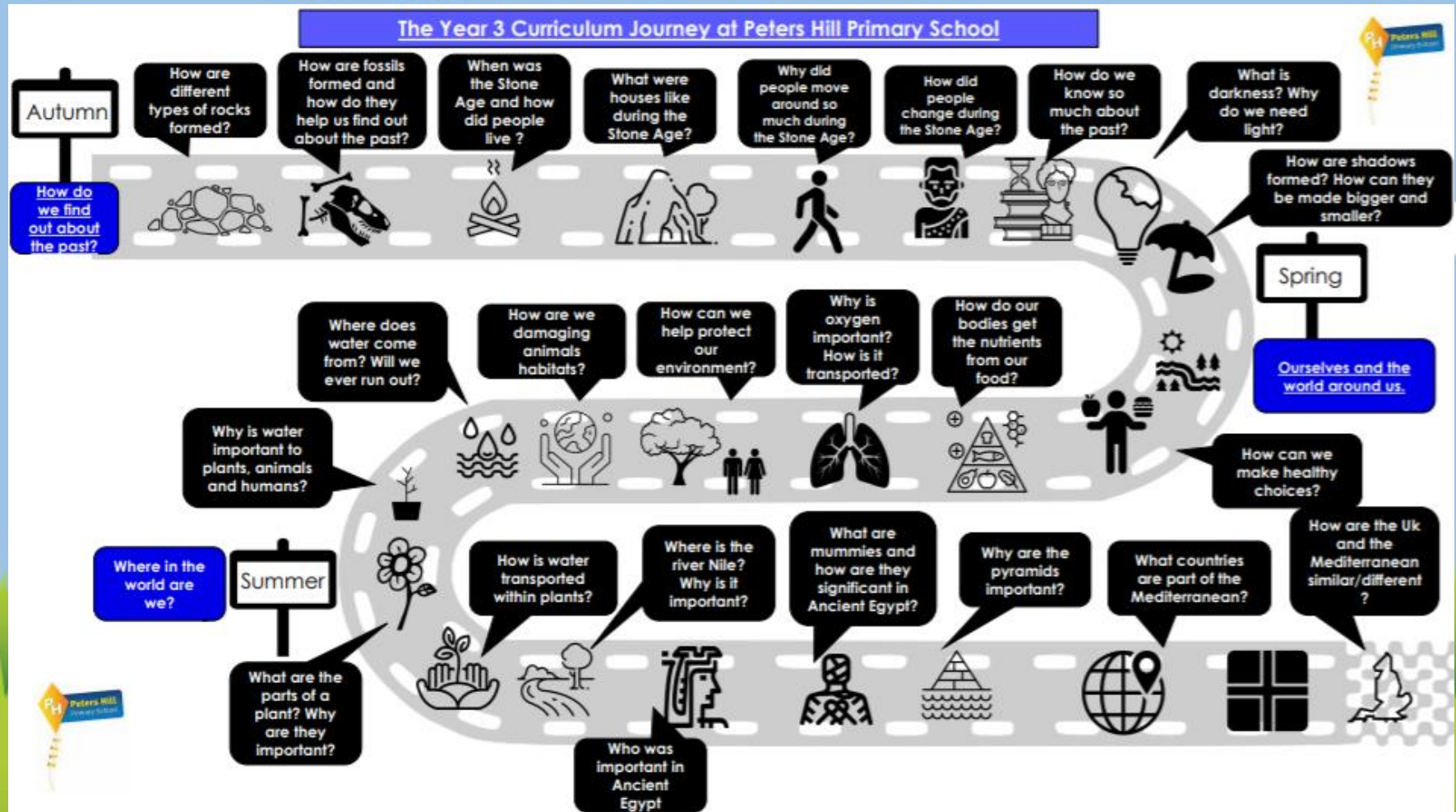
At Peters Hill our commitment is that every child in Year 3 and 4 will have a story time every single day, building on from their Key Stage 1 experience. First and foremost, this is a chance for the children to enjoy being read to by their teacher. Secondly, this will enable children to be exposed to, and develop their understanding of, a wide range of ambitious vocabulary. Children will discuss books, authors, illustrators, likes and dislikes, recognize similarities in plots, themes and characters and also embed newly acquired vocabulary into their own speaking, and in their writing.

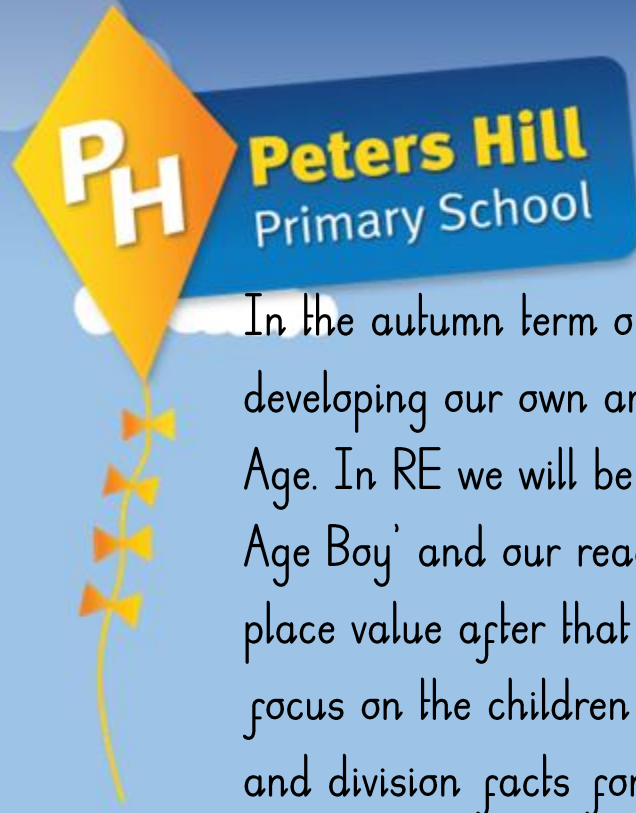

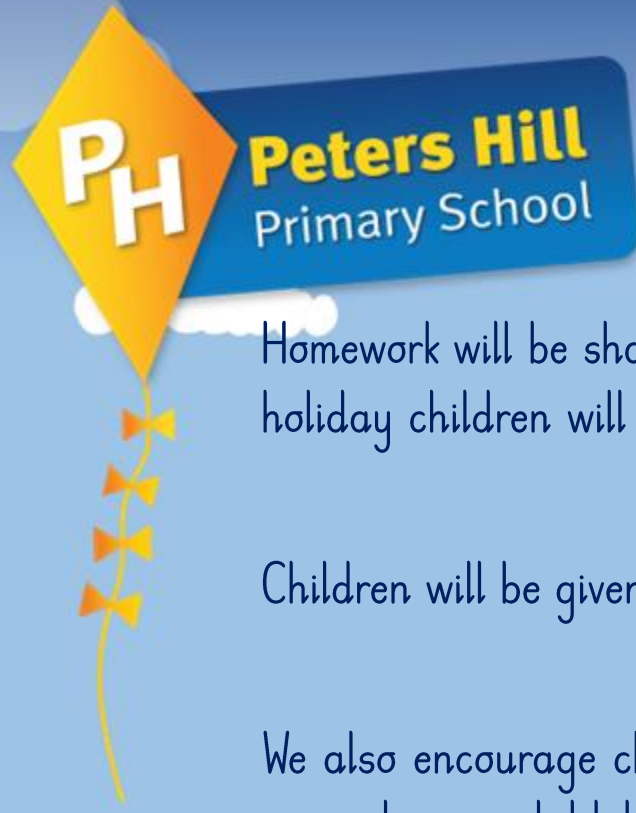




Autumn Term Learning

In the autumn term our topic will be The Stone Age. We will be investigating rocks and soils in Science, developing our own art in the style of cave paintings, as well as finding out what it was like to live in the Stone Age. In RE we will be finding out all about the Sikh faith. In English we will read a book called 'The Stone Age Boy' and our reading and writing tasks will be based around the story. In Maths our first topic will be place value after that we will move onto addition and subtraction. Throughout the year in Maths there will be a focus on the children learning their multiplication tables. We aim for children to know all of the multiplication and division facts for the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables.

Your child will have a Stone Age research project to carry out over the summer holiday which will be displayed in their classrooms. The more creative the better! There will be more information about this to follow.



Homework

Homework will be shared regularly and this will alternate between a Maths and an English task. As we approach a holiday children will be set a topic research task to prepare them for learning in the next half term.

Children will be given spellings to learn each week and the test will be completed in class the following week.

We also encourage children to spend 10 minutes each day reading. This is still very important in Year 3, you can support your child by asking them questions about what they have read, developing their comprehension skills. Children will also be set online books on Myon which they can read and then quiz on to check how well they have understood the text.

When your child reads at home, please continue to sign their reading record. They will then be able to move up on our class Reading Races and receive rewards.



Times Tables



It is really important for children to learn their times tables in Year 3 as they are needed for a variety of topics in Maths. The aim is for children to know their 2, 5, and 10 times tables by the end of Year 2 and then their 3, 4, and 8 during their time in Year 3.

We use Times Tables Rockstars to help with children learning their tables alongside other methods in class. You will find log in details in the front of your child's reading record.

Another game which is really good and is free to access is Hit the Button which focuses on one times table at a time.
