5MB – Out of classroom door

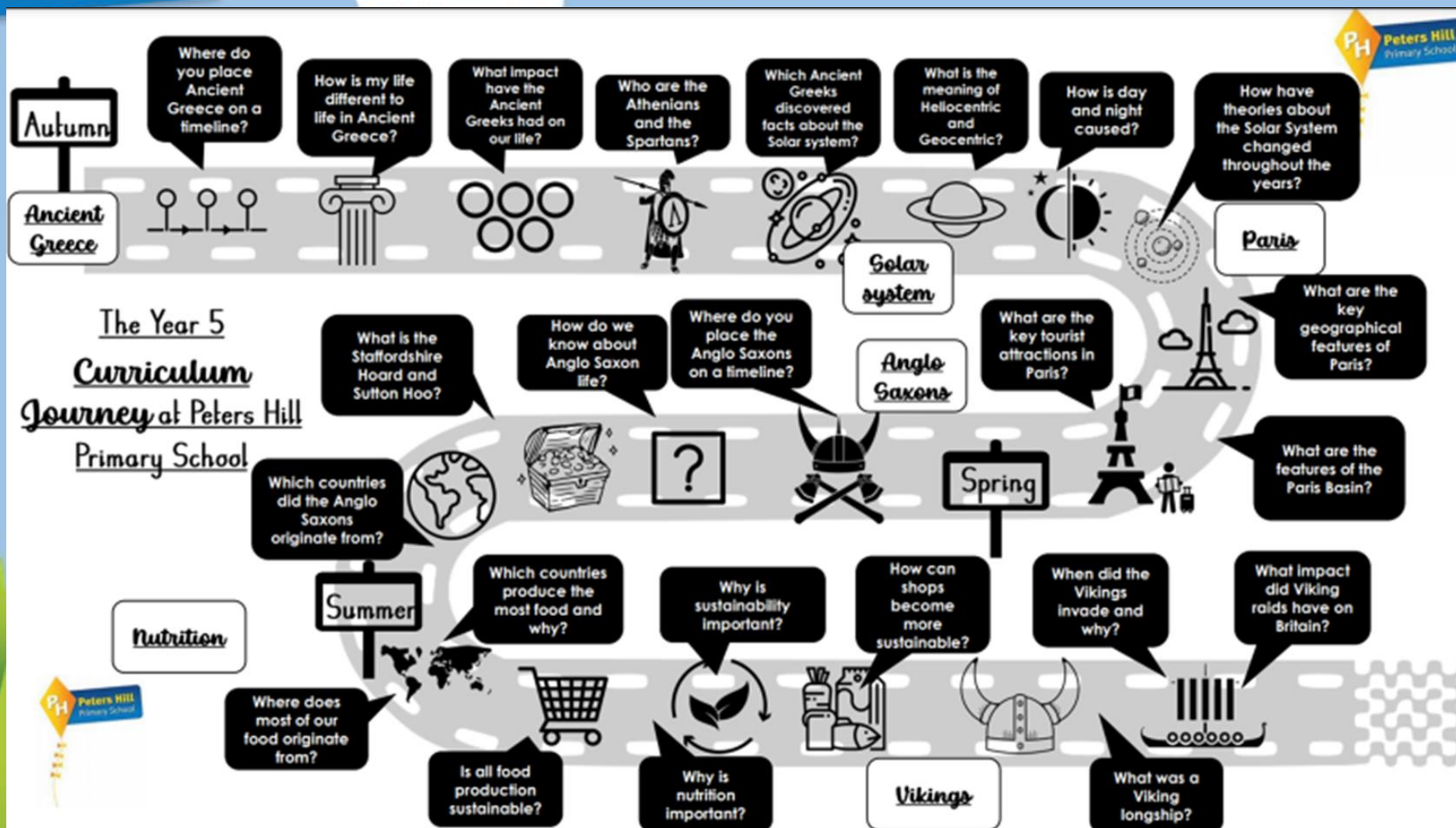

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Place Value

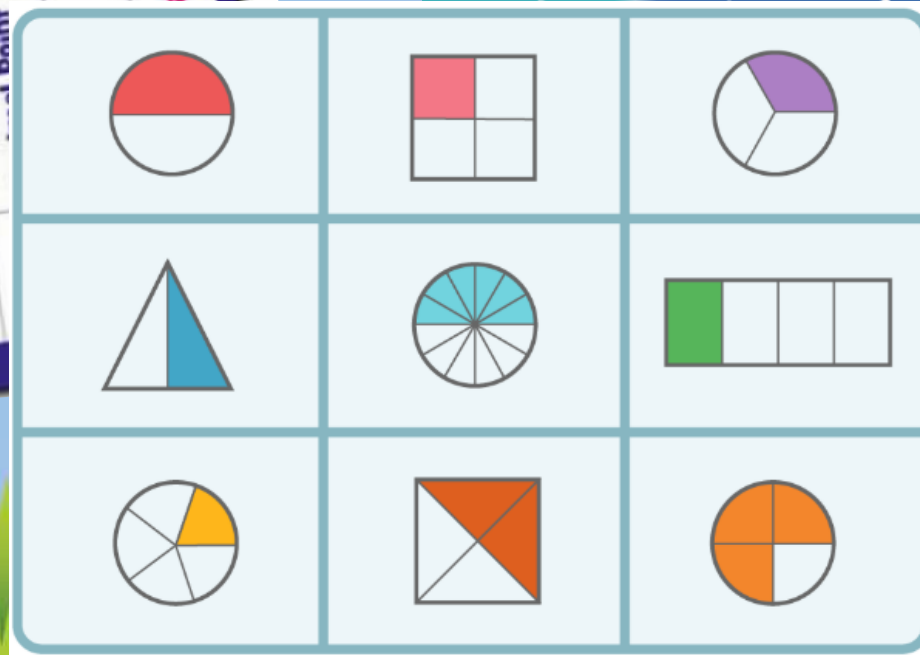
Place value determines the value of a digit based on its location within a number.

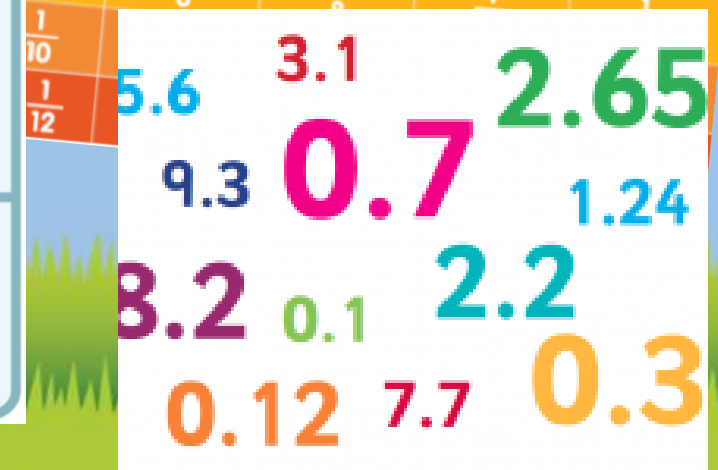

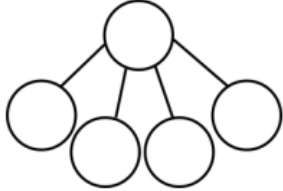

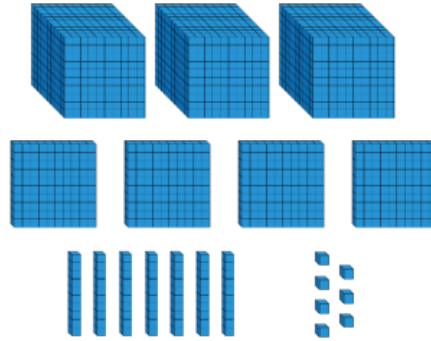

Number - number and place value

Pupils should be taught to:

- read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1,000,000 and determine the value of each digit
- count forwards or backwards in steps of powers of 10 for any given number up to 1,000,000
- interpret negative numbers in context, count forwards and backwards with positive and negative whole numbers, including through 0
- round any number up to 1,000,000 to the nearest 10, 100, 1,000, 10,000 and 100,000
- solve number problems and practical problems that involve all of the above
- read Roman numerals to 1,000 (M) and recognise years written in Roman numerals

Bikeability...

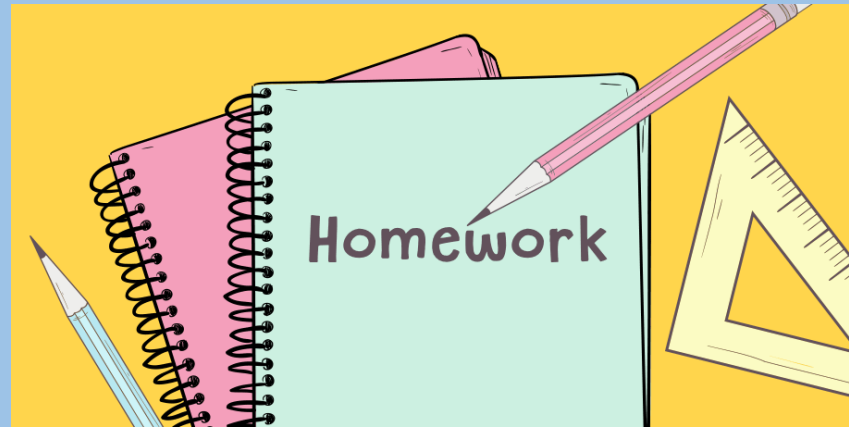

Reading

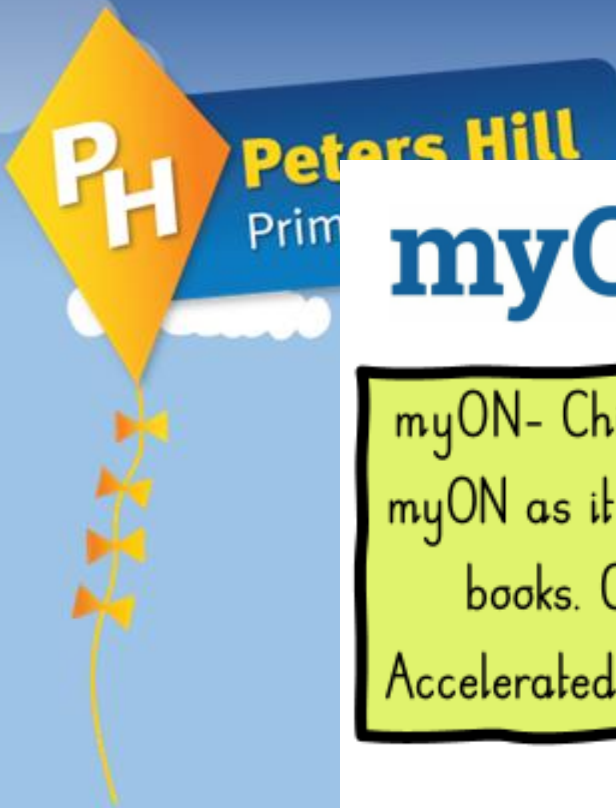


Children are encouraged to read at least three times a week at home with an adult and are rewarded for moving up the class reading race in the classroom. Children earn rewards for moving up the reading race and children show evidence of this reading through their home reading records. Prizes include bookmarks, rulers, pencils and erasers, working their way up to a brand new book when they read 40 books.

We use Accelerated Reader to quiz on books that we have read to determine our understanding. Children receive prizes for achieving their personal Accelerated Reading target which is based on their ZPD and star assessment, and for reading half a million and one million words (more detail on next page) Children in year 5 print their TOP's reports to bring home after quizzing to show their targets and progress.

Children in year 5 have four, 15 minute ERIC slots each week. During these ERIC slots, children complete reading activities in their reading journals, complete AR quizzes or read independently or as a class. There is a wide choice of books for home reading with access to the year group library of Accelerated Reader books, whole class readers, Collins 'Big Cat' books, non-fiction texts and 'First News' newspapers every week. Children also have access to myON at home which they can then complete an Accelerated Reader quiz on in school. Accelerated reader books are stored in ZPD (zone of proximal development) levels and children choose a book in their ZPD in order to challenge and engage them as they read.

myON- Children are encouraged to read on myON as it gives access to a huge library of books. Children can then complete an Accelerated Reader quiz for any myON book.



Times table rockstars- Children are encouraged to use this to work on fluency and confidence with multiplication tables.

MyMaths- Homework may be set on MyMaths. Occasionally additional work may be set to consolidate skills from lessons.

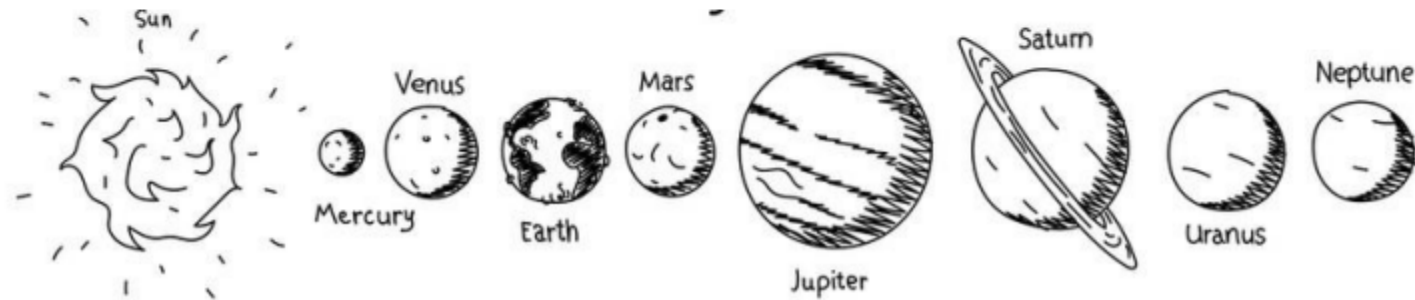


Our first topic will be... *The Solar System*
