**Read Write Inc** - daily sounds, reading and writing activities.

Chapter 2 - Number Bonds - to understand that numbers are made up of other numbers and find many different ways to construct a number. To use number bonds for storytelling.

Chapter 3 - Addition Within 10 - To add two different numbers within 10, to add by counting on, to complete number sentences, to make addition stories using the correct vocabulary, to solve addition problems through pictures.
