What happened at the beginning, middle and end of the story? Where was the story set? Can you draw and label a picture of the fruit in the story?
	Maths -Practise the additions to 20. Remember to count on to find the answer. (Refer to addition to 20 colour sheet).
Tuesday	Literacy TaskCan you write a postcard to your friend? (Refer to postcard sheet).
	Maths -Can you continue the pattern on the snakes? Perhaps you could have a go at making your own colour pattern! (Refer to continue the pattern sheet).
Wednesday	Literacy task- Environments – ArcticShare the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers available by clicking on the following link - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cRAAQ8EWzig With your child explore penguin facts on the internet. What information have you found? Can you write it down? You make like to make your own non-fiction big book about penguins!
	Maths -Can you have a look at 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 20p, 50p, £1 and £2 coins. You may have some of these coins at home. What colour and shape are the coins? Can you count out some 1p coins? How many do you have?
Thursday	Literacy and Maths TaskCan you make some coin rubbings using crayons or colouring pencils? Place the coins under some paper and rub your crayon over the paper and coin. What coin can you see? Maybe you could use some of your toys to set up a shop in your house. You could practise playing shop with your family at home.
