Your underwear covers your private parts and no one should ask to see or touch them.

If you are worried about this you must tell someone so we can help you.

Hitting, punching or smacking you

Has someone hit, punched or smacked you or hurt you in anyway?

You must tell someone so we can help you.

Trying to give you tablets, smoking, drugs or alcohol

Has someone asked you if you want a tablet or to smoke, or have a drink or eat something and you do not know what it is?

Do not eat, drink or smoke what they are giving you. If you are not sure check with a trusted adult.
