LEARNING INTENTION: How rules can help at home and in school.

CONTENT | WHOLE CLASS CORE INPUT

Read this story with your child and discuss the key questions.

Rules of sport

Robin asked his big brother David if he would play football with him. David explained that football has rules and that you have to keep the rules to play properly. Robin was only four so he did not understand about the rules of football. David explained simply that he had to try to get the ball and kick it into the net. David knew he had to be patient with Robin. Robin ran round making silly noises, kicked David and picked up the ball and ran up the garden path.

When he came back David asked him whether he wanted to play with the other boys in the park. 'Yes, yes', replied Robin.

'Right,' said David, 'well if you are going to play with others you have to learn some rules or no one will want to play with you.'

David told Robin he must kick the ball and not pick it up, he was to keep on the pitch and not hurt other players.

Robin understood and tried hard when he and David practiced. The next week Robin was joining in the game with other boys and girls in the park. He really enjoyed himself. David was proud of him.

- Q What new rules did Robin learn?
- Q Why were they important?
- Q What do you think of David?
- Q What made Robin happy?
- What would have happened if Robin had not followed the rules when he played with the others?
- Are there good and bad rules, give examples? (e.g. it might be rules made up by one person who is being bossy about their game.)

Activity

What new rules do we have because of the Corona Virus?
Why is it important to keep these rules?
Draw and write about rules at home and Corona Virus rules.
